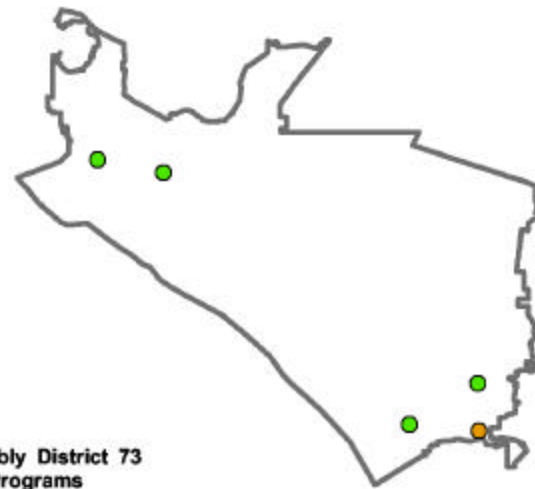


UC in Your District

UC SAN DIEGO

UC San Diego is among the nation's top-ranked institutions of higher education, is the third largest employer in the San Diego area and has an economic impact of \$4.6 billion. In 2002 UC San Diego managed 300 new inventions, created 10 new companies and generated \$13.5 million in royalties. **UC scientists have founded one in four California biotech firms – including three of the world's largest – Amgen, Genentech and Chiron.** The planned Graduate Management School will support the demand for management expertise in a variety of fields including biomedicine, engineering and health care.



UC SAN DIEGO MEDICAL CENTER

UC San Diego Medical Center provides services throughout District 73 and is the region's only academic medical center. The medical center cares for a disproportionate share of the region's poor and uninsured patients and is the county's only Level 1 Trauma Center. **The Medical Center includes a Regional Burn Center, a National Institutes of Health Clinical Research Center, the Infant Special Care Center and the region's only National Cancer Institute.** The UC San Diego LA Jolla Medical Center site offers a range of services and includes the **Shiley Eye Center**, which provides patients with vision services.



CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

To help ensure that California maintains its leadership in the telecommunications and info-tech marketplace, the **California Institute for Telecommunications and Information Technology (Cal-IT)²** teams UC researchers with leading California companies to bring wireless technology to the next stage. Researchers will investigate how these technologies will bring advances in environmental science, transportation, biomedicine and education. Research sites will be housed on both the UCSD and UCI campuses.

The UC Irvine Gifted Students Academy was developed to assist gifted students to set their sights toward a scholarly collegiate experience. UCI provides an environment that enables students to experience the accelerated pace and advanced level curriculum required for college admissions and future careers. The program works with students at several K-12 schools in District 73 – including Fallbrook Street Elementary and multiple schools in Mission Viejo.

The VA San Diego Healthcare System is an affiliate of the **UCSD Medical Center** and provides a full range of medical care to **238,000 veterans in San Diego and Imperial Counties.**

UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) has provided academic support, career advising, college counseling and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college education. **EAOP works with several schools in District 73, including El Camino and Oceanside High Schools and Martin Luther King Jr., Jefferson and Roosevelt Middle Schools .**

UC Irvine's Chemistry Outreach program has teams of graduate and undergraduate students visit Orange County schools to perform demonstrations and talk about chemistry. Since 1992, over 24, 000 students have been reached – including those at **Dana Hills High in Dana Point and Laguna Beach High – both in District 73.**

The UC Davis Animal Ambassadors program uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children's interest in science. The program uses interactive materials and written curriculum for classrooms that develop scientific inquiry and critical thinking skills. Between 3,500 - 4,000 children participated in the program between 1999-2002. **The program is present in schools throughout San Diego County.**



The Puente Project runs programs at 51 community colleges and 35 high schools throughout California to increase the enrollment and retention of educationally underserved students in four-year universities

and works with **Mira Costa Community College in District 73.** To date, Puente has provided mentoring, teaching, and counseling for over 20,000 under-represented students. Puente students graduate from 4-year universities at twice the average rate. <http://www.puente.net>

UC's California Subject Matter Projects develop teachers' knowledge in major K-12 subject areas by enhancing instructional strategies, providing access to the techniques that improve student achievement, and developing 'teacher-leaders' – at over 500 California school districts. With the expertise of teachers and UC faculty, the program annually trains thousands of teachers through intensive summer courses at **schools throughout District 73 – including Mission Viejo High and Malcolm Elementary in Laguna Niguel.** <http://sep.uci.edu/>
