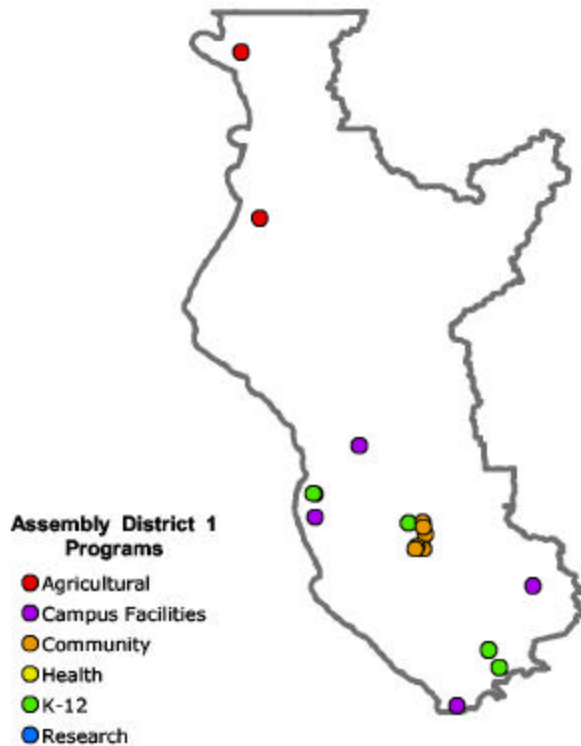


UC at Work in Your District

NATURAL RESERVE SYSTEM

The UC Davis Natural Reserve System Bodega Marine Laboratory has emerged in recent years as one of the Pacific Coast's leading research institutions. The laboratory has achieved international recognition in several areas of marine science. The facility is located on **Bodega Head in Sonoma County in District 1.**



UC AND THE WINE INDUSTRY

The wine industry in District 1 is heavily dependent on UC Davis' pioneering technology and innovative cultural practices. Selection of better yielding clones of chardonnay at UC fueled dramatic changes in the industry, bringing its current crop value to \$300 million. Vintners rely on UC's network of advisors at **Cooperative Extension offices in Lake, Humboldt, Trinity, Sonoma, and Del Norte counties in District 1.** The new **UC Mondavi Institute for Wine and Food Science at UC Davis** will house the largest and most prestigious wine and food science academic program in the world.



UC DAVIS MEDICAL CENTER

The UC Davis Medical Center, the region's only academic medical center, is a fully accredited, 457-bed hospital. **UCD Medical Center is the sole Level 1 Trauma Center serving the residents of Humboldt, Lake and surrounding counties. The UC Davis Health System is also a leader in the field of Telemedicine.** UCD Medical Center has expanded the scope of its services to electronically meet the needs of the Northern California region, by linking hospitals and primary care practices to the medical center. **This innovative program allows physicians in remote areas of the North State to care for their patients locally.**

The Bay Area Social Services Consortium (BASSC) is composed of county Social Service Directors and the graduate social work programs at UC Berkeley, CSU Sacramento, CSU San Jose and CSU San Francisco. BASSC develops educational, applied research and policy development programs in collaboration with county agency administrators and staff. <http://cssr.berkeley.edu/bassc>



The MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement) California Community College Program increases the number of math and science majors who successfully transfer and receive university degrees. MESA runs a program site at **Mendocino College in District 1**.

The UCSF Medical Center and the hospitals operated by and affiliated with UCSF are among the world's greatest health care institutions. UCSF Medical Center provides services throughout District 1.

UCSF's Intensive Care Nursery (ICN) Follow-Up Program assesses the neurodevelopmental progress of infants by providing parent support after discharge, early identification of developmental disabilities and liaison with community physicians and agencies. **An ICN satellite clinic is located in Eureka in District 1.** <http://www.ucsfhealth.org>

UC Davis' Oiled Wildlife Care Network strives to ensure that wildlife exposed to petroleum products in the environment receive treatment. The project's services are offered at the **Bird Rescue Center in Santa Rosa** and at **CSU Humboldt**. www.vetmed.ucdavis.edu/owcn



VA Northern California Health Care System (NCHCS) is an affiliate of the **University of California Davis Medical Center**, and provides a full range of medical care to over **417,000 veterans in Northern state region**. The UC Davis California Raptor Center rehabilitates injured birds of prey and serves Yolo, Solano, Marin, Contra Costa, Sacramento, Placer, Alameda, San Francisco, Glenn, San Joaquin and Sonoma counties. UCSF's Family Practice Residency program at Sutter Medical Center in **Santa Rosa** provides a host of community medical services to underserved populations in **District 1**.
