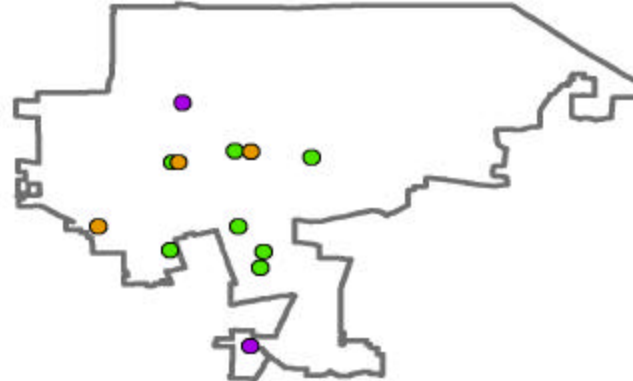


UC in Your District

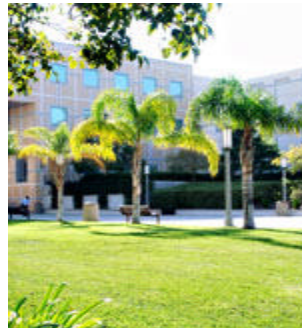

UC IRVINE MEDICAL CENTER

The UC Irvine Medical Center located in District 72, has a strong academic reputation in neurosciences, cancer and genetics research. The UC Irvine Medical Center in Orange, California, the Long Beach Veterans Affairs Medical Center and the Long Beach Memorial Medical Center provides cutting-edge medical research to the general population and to a disproportionate share of the area's poor and uninsured. UCI Medical Center's 462-bed facility is Orange County's only designated comprehensive emergency service and Level I Trauma Referral Center.



UC IRVINE

UC Irvine – near District 72, is one of the top American universities and has a \$2.35 billion economic impact on Orange County. UC Irvine is responsible for the creation of more than 15,000 jobs in Orange County. Noted internationally for its rich academic programs, UC Irvine offers 55 undergraduate majors, 49 minors and a myriad of specializations. UC Irvine also hosts an internationally acclaimed teaching hospital and medical center, a School of Education, a School of Management and the Henry Samueli School of Engineering.



CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

To help ensure that California maintains its leadership in the rapidly changing telecommunications and information technology marketplace, **UC San Diego and UC Irvine have created the California Institute for Telecommunications and Information Technology (CaIT)². The institute teams UC researchers with leading California telecomm and computer companies to conduct research on the scientific and technological components needed to bring wireless technology to the next level. Research sites will be housed at UCSD and UCI.**



The Puente Project runs programs at 51 community colleges and 35 high schools throughout California to increase the enrollment and retention of educationally underserved students in four-year universities. Puente works

with **Anaheim High, Katella High, Magnolia High, Savanna High and Fullerton Community College in District 72.**

Puente students graduate from 4-year universities at twice the average rate. <http://www.puente.net>

UC Irvine's Chemistry Outreach program has teams of graduate and undergraduate students visit Orange County schools to perform demonstrations and talk about chemistry. Since 1992, over 24,000 students have been reached, including those at **Anaheim High, Canyon High, Magnolia High, Savanna High and La Habra High in District 72.**

ArtsBridge is a UC arts education and outreach program that works with California public schools, including **Centralia Elementary, Fullerton Union High, Ladera Vista Junior High and Clara Barton Elementary in District 72.** ArtsBridge also provides scholarships to qualified students to

Healthcare Access to Schools (HATS) helps children from low-income families obtain health insurance in **District 72.** Since its inception, UC San Diego has provided funds and technical assistance to dozens of schools.

UC's California Subject Matter Projects develop teachers' knowledge in major K-12 subject areas by enhancing instructional strategies, providing access to the techniques that improve student achievement, and developing 'teacher-leaders' – at over 500 California school districts. With the expertise of teachers and UC faculty, the program annually trains thousands of teachers through intensive summer courses **at schools throughout District 72. Intensive science courses are run at Arovista Elementary in Brea and El Dorado High in Placentia.**

UC Irvine's Criminology Outreach Program familiarizes **local students** with college course content, introduces intellectual pursuits and involves students in the type of policy debates that occur in the field of criminology. www.cfep.uci.edu

The UC Irvine Gifted Students Academy was developed to assist gifted students to set their sights toward a scholarly collegiate experience. UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement) Program prepares educationally disadvantaged students for four-year colleges at **nine schools in District 72, including South Junior High in Anaheim and Kraemer Junior High in Placentia.** The **MESA California Community College Program** increases the number of math and science majors who successfully transfer and receive degrees from 4-year universities and works with **CSU Fullerton and Fullerton Community College.** <http://mesa.ucop.edu>



UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) has provided academic support, career advising, college counseling and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college

UC Riverside's CE-CERT program contributes to improved environmental quality and energy efficiency through interdisciplinary research and by providing educational opportunities for the next generation of engineers, scientists and policy-makers in the region. <http://www.cert.ucr.edu>

UC Cooperative Extension advisors in the **Orange County office** work with families to improve nutrition and health, and teach youth leadership skills. **4-H advisors** and the Orange County fair have created "**Agademics**" to teach **fifth-graders about gardening and the origin of food.** <http://ucanr.org>



UC Irvine's San Joaquin Freshwater Marsh Reserve, located near District 72, represents one of the last remnants of freshwater wetlands that once covered much of Orange County's flood plain.

The marsh was restored by UC Irvine (with grants from the Ford Foundation) and is located within a ten-minute walk from UCI, making it convenient for day use by faculty and hundreds of students annually. The reserve serves as both an important research center and educational resource on issues such as migratory birds, water quality management and marsh ecosystems.
