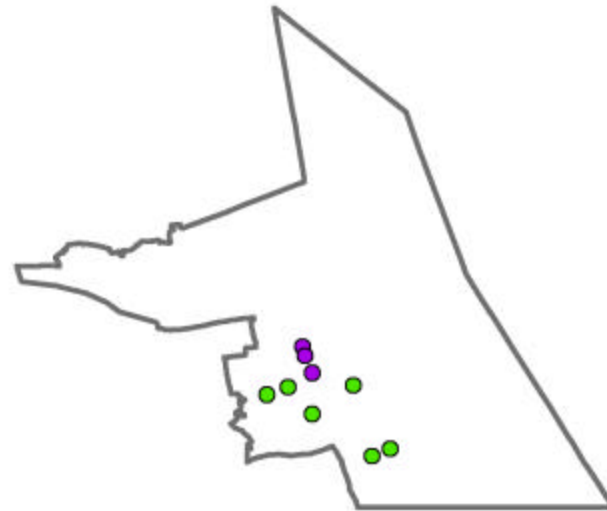


## UC in Your District

### UCSF AND UCSF MEDICAL CENTER

**UC San Francisco is one of San Francisco's largest employers, contributing more than \$1 billion annually to the Bay Area economy and spawning hundreds of biotechnology enterprises.** UCSF has created **three Nobel laureates** in the last decade and is a leader in patient care, biomedical research, and health science education. **The UCSF Medical Center, in District 13,** ranks among the best hospitals in the nation and handles 1/2 of all hospital admissions in San Francisco **and a disproportionate share of the area's poor and uninsured.** The Medical Center also operates an AIDS Clinical Trial Unit.

### THE CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE FOR QUANTITATIVE BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH (QB 3)

QB 3 is a cooperative effort between **UC and private industry** aimed at developing the cutting-edge research discoveries that will continue to drive the field of biomedicine. **QB 3 will drive the new technologies and research that will spawn a host of biomedical innovations and train thousands of researchers in the Bay Area.** QB 3 will be housed at two new buildings on the UC Santa Cruz campus, a new UC Berkeley facility and a site at **UC San Francisco's Mission Bay campus.**

### UCSF HEALTHCARE IN THE COMMUNITY

**UCSF's Breast Cancer Early Detection Program Regional Partnership** provides breast cancer screening, diagnostic services, and outreach to low-income women over 40 in **District 13.**



**California Partners for Advanced Transit in Highways (PATH), at the UC Berkeley Institute of Transportation Studies**, brings together faculty and students with private industry and state/local agencies to develop the research technologies that will improve California's transport systems, including developing solutions for the state's public transit challenges. <http://www.path.berkeley.edu>

**UCSF research was among the first to identify HIV** as the causative agent of the disease and the campus continues to lead in HIV treatment and research programs. **UCSF AIDS Health Project** is the sole provider of HIV-specific mental health programs and **HIV InSite**, a comprehensive resource for treatment, prevention and policy, which links UCSF expertise with academics, doctors and patients worldwide. <http://hivinsite.ucsf.edu>



**ArtsBridge** is a UC arts education and outreach program that works to provide hands-on arts instruction arts in under-performing Bay Area public schools. ArtsBridge also provides scholarships to qualified students to teach the arts and conduct arts-related workshops in local communities.

**UCSF's Student Homeless Clinic** provides the services of medical and nursing students and physicians to homeless people at district sites such as the 5th Street Multi-Service Center. **UCSF's Homeless Veterans Health Care** program reaches homeless veterans in San Francisco shelters, detox centers and on the streets.



**Nursing School faculty from UCSF and CSU San Francisco** have partnered at the Valencia Health Services Clinic which provides primary health care to **2,650 infants, children and adolescents in San Francisco**. The clinic combines UC's expertise in pediatric, women's health, and family care and CSU's experience in case management and public health. <http://nurseweb.ucsf.edu>

**UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP)** has provided academic support, career advising, college counseling and motivational/skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college education. In the Bay Area, EAOP works with disadvantaged students in **37 high schools and 37 middle schools in Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco and Santa Clara counties**. <http://www.eaop.org>

**The Mental Health Research Group at UC Berkeley's School of Social Welfare** works with California counties to pursue timely research on issues in mental health such as residential care, psychiatric emergency services and homelessness. <http://socialwelfare.berkeley.edu>

**UC Berkeley's Environmental Sciences Program and the Department of Ethnic Studies** have worked in partnership with the **Galileo Academy of Science and Technology** and the **Urban Watershed Project** to implement a three-year high school environmental science course which incorporates field study, mentoring and web-based learning under the guidance of the National Park Service at the Presidio.



**The History Through Literature Project at UC Berkeley** builds curriculums for K-12 teachers on topics ranging from Latin America's literary history to the spread of

Islam. Seminars and an online database of lesson plans support thousands of teachers statewide.

**The Public Law Research Institute at UC's Hastings College of the Law** serves California legislators and agencies by analyzing the legal issues that confront California's state and local governments.
