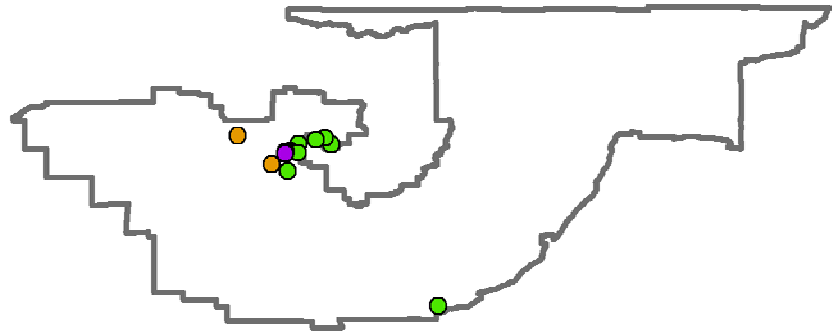


### UC in Your District

#### UCSF FRESNO MEDICAL CARE

**The UCSF Fresno Medical Education Program** gives Central Valley residents access to the highest quality health care services while training the region's next generation of resident physicians.

**The UCSF Fresno Center** has developed an innovative model for training doctors and providing health services through 'telemedicine' in remote rural areas. As teaching hospital affiliated with the UCLA, UCSD and UCI Schools of Medicine, **Kern Medical Center** in Bakersfield trains more than 100 residents each year, specializing in emergency medicine, family practice, internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, and surgery.

**The UC Riverside Genomics Institute** brings together faculty from every academic unit on campus to foster innovations that will make possible advancements in the quality of life - from **greater productivity in California's \$27-billion agricultural industry** and more nutritious foods to improved human health and environmental quality.

**The Public Law Research Institute at UC's Hastings College of the Law** serves California legislators and agencies by analyzing the legal issues that confront California's state and local governments. **UC's California Subject Matter Projects** develop teachers' knowledge in major K-12 subject areas by enhancing instructional strategies, providing access to the techniques that improve student achievement, and developing 'teacher-leaders' – at over 500 California school districts including **several Bakersfield elementary schools**. **UC Merced's Office of Admissions/Relations with Schools and Colleges** prepares students for admission to UC by providing counseling, advising and college prep services to students, parents, educators and the community at large. The office sponsors a wide range of workshops, programs, and advising services for 144 high schools and 11 community colleges in 13 Central Valley counties. **UC Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources Cooperative Extension** provides accessible and comprehensive agricultural research information for local growers, ranchers, governments and the larger community through county advisors located at the **Bakersfield office**. <http://ucanr.org/>

**Lindcove Research and Extension Center**, established by San Joaquin Valley growers and UC Riverside, provides research for the central California citrus industry. Researchers focus on areas such as the management of citrus pests.

**UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP)** has provided academic support, career advising, college counseling, motivational and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college education. **EAOP works with 33 high school, middle and elementary schools in Kern County – including Bakersfield High School.** <http://www.eaop.org>

**The UC Shafter Research and Extension Center** is the principal field research facility for the cotton industry and serves as a model collaboration between UC, the USDA and the Kern County agricultural community. <http://danrec.ucdavis.edu/shafter>

**The UC Davis Mathematics Project (UCDMP) serves teachers and school districts throughout the entire Central Valley and into the lower reaches of the Sierras.** UCDMP offers a variety of programs for mathematics teachers, including two tiers of intensive Summer Institutes that provide teachers from K-Community College the opportunity to develop problem-solving strategies, learn new math content and instructional techniques. <http://sup.ucdavis.edu/>

**The California Policy Research Center (CPRC)** applies UC's research expertise to the analysis, development and implementation of state and federal policy. CPRC provides policy-relevant UC-led research on statewide issues, oversees legislatively mandated research projects, and disseminates research findings through publications and special briefings. CPRC also hosts projects such as the Welfare Policy Research Project (WPRP), the California Program on Access to Care (CPAC), the Latino Policy Institute and the California-Mexico Health Initiative (CMHI). <http://www.ucop.edu/cprc/>



**The Veterinary Teaching Hospital at UC Davis is the only veterinary teaching hospital in California and provides services to more than 27,000 animals each year.** UC Davis' Center for Equine Health (CEH) is leading the way in research to

unravel the mysteries of colic, the painful abdominal malady that is the number one killer of horses. The School of Vet Medicine's new **Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Lab** will provide drug testing for California racehorses as well as studies evaluating the effectiveness of medications and other products on racehorse performance. **The San Joaquin Valley is home to two UC Davis veterinary programs** that produce work and research of benefit to Valley residents and consumers nationwide.
