

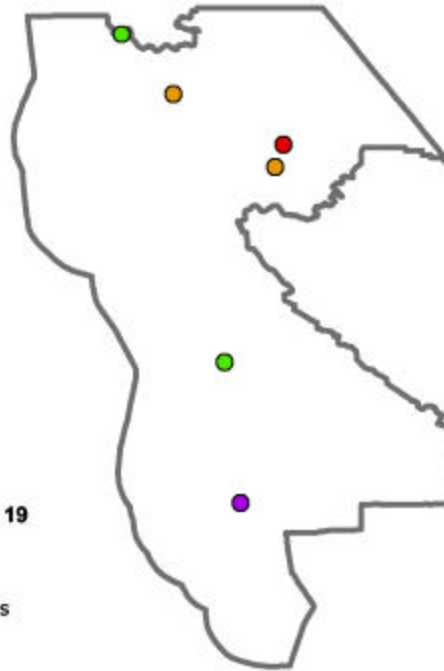
UC in Your District

UC SAN FRANCISCO AND UCSF MEDICAL CENTER

UC San Francisco – near District 19, is one of San Francisco's largest employers, contributing more than \$1 billion annually to the Bay Area economy and spawning hundreds of biotechnology enterprises. UCSF has created **three Nobel laureates** in the last decade and is a leader in patient care, biomedical research and health science education. **The UCSF Medical Center near District 19,** ranks among the best hospitals in the nation and with its affiliated hospitals, **handles 1/2 of all hospital admissions in San Francisco – and cares for a disproportionate share of the area's poor and uninsured.**

UC'S NEW TEACHER CENTER

The first of its kind, **the New Teacher Center (NTC) at UC Santa Cruz,** is a nearby national resource dedicated to teacher development and the support of practices that promote excellence and diversity in America's teaching force. **At schools throughout the peninsula,** New Teacher Seminars give teachers the opportunity to problem-solve with colleagues, learn new teaching strategies and exchange lesson plans.

INSTITUTE FOR QUANTITATIVE BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH (QB 3)

QB 3 is a cooperative effort between **UC and private industry** aimed at developing the cutting-edge research discoveries that will continue to drive the field of biomedicine. **QB 3 will drive the new technologies and research that will spawn a host of biomedical innovations and train thousands of researchers in the Bay Area.** QB 3 will be housed at two new buildings on the UC Santa Cruz campus, a new UC Berkeley facility and a **site at UC San Francisco's Mission Bay campus.**



The History Through Literature Project at UC Berkeley builds curriculums for K-12 teachers on topics ranging from Latin America's literary history to the spread of

Islam. Seminars and an on-line database of lesson plans support thousands of teachers statewide.

The Public Law Research Institute at UC's Hastings College of the Law serves California legislators and agencies by analyzing the legal issues that confront California's state and local governments. California Partners for Advanced Transit in Highways (PATH), at the UCB Institute of Transportation Studies brings together faculty and students with private

The Breast Cancer Early Detection Program Regional Partnership, at the UCSF Comprehensive Cancer Center, provides breast cancer screening, diagnostic services, and outreach to low-income women over 40 in this district. The UC-affiliated national labs host several science education programs, including the Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory's award-winning **Virtual Frog Dissection Web Site** designed for classrooms statewide.

UCSF research was among the first to identify HIV as the causative agent of the disease and the campus continues to lead in HIV treatment and research programs. **UCSF AIDS Health Project** is the sole provider of HIV-specific mental health programs in the nation. **UCSF's HIV InSite** is a comprehensive web resource for treatment, prevention and policy, which links UC expertise with academics, doctors and patients worldwide. <http://hivinsite.ucsf.edu>



The Puente Project runs programs at 51 community colleges and 35 high schools, in order to increase the enrollment of educationally underserved students in 4-year universities. Puente works with **San Francisco City College and**

the College of San Mateo in District 19. To date, Puente has provided mentoring, teaching, and counseling for over 20,000 under-represented students. <http://www.puente.net>

The Bay Area Social Services Consortium (BASSC) is composed of county Social Service Directors and the graduate social work programs at UC Berkeley, CSU Sacramento, CSU San Jose and CSU San Francisco.
