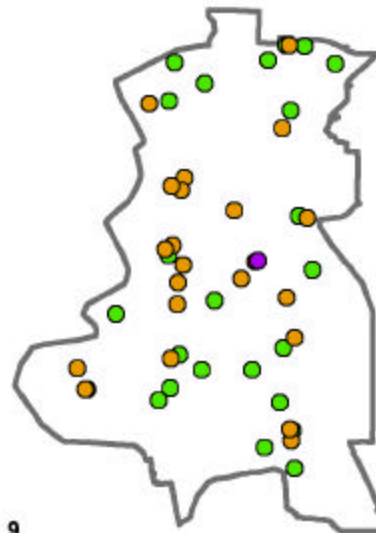


UC in Your District

UC DAVIS AND UC DAVIS MEDICAL CENTER

UC Davis is a premier research university, the largest employer in Yolo County and has an annual economic impact of more than \$1.4 billion. **The UCD Medical Center in District 9 ranks among the nation's best hospitals** and is the region's only academic medical center. The medical center operates an **AIDS Clinical Trial Unit, a regional Burn Center - that serves 2 million residents across the region, a Nursing Research Center and the Center for Health Services Research.** The Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts **hosts a wealth of cultural and artistic performances in District 9.**



UC DAVIS VETERINARY HOSPITAL

The Veterinary Teaching Hospital at UC Davis **is the only veterinary teaching hospital in California and provides services to more than 27,000 animals each year.** UC Davis' Center for Equine Health (CEH) is leading the way in research to unravel the mysteries of colic, the painful abdominal malady that is the number one killer of horses. The new **Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Lab** will provide drug testing for California racehorses as well as studies evaluating the effectiveness of medications on racehorse performance.



UC DAVIS WESTERN INSTITUTE FOR FOOD SAFETY AND SECURITY

The UC Davis Western Institute for Food Safety and Security is dedicated to **research and education for food safety and security issues in the state** and is a partnership between UC, the California Department of Food and Agriculture and the California Department of Health Services. **The institute will focus research on developing better capabilities to identify food-borne hazards and prevent food-borne illnesses and outbreaks.** The institute will also provide food-safety education programs to consumers and those in food-related industries.

UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement) works to prepare educationally disadvantaged students for four-year colleges at **87 K-12 school sites in the greater Sacramento region, including Del Paso Heights Elementary in District 9.** The **MESA California Community College Program** increases the number of math and science majors who successfully transfer and receive degrees from 4-year universities and works with **Sacramento City College.**

ArtsBridge is a UC arts education and outreach program that works with California public schools to provide high quality arts education. **ArtsBridge has active programs in 14 schools in the Sacramento area – including Alice Birney Elementary in District 9.** The program also provides scholarships to qualified students to teach the arts and conduct arts-related workshops in local communities.

UC's California Subject Matter Projects develop teacher knowledge in K-12 subjects by enhancing instructional strategies, improving **teacher retention and support systems**, providing access to techniques that improve achievement, and developing 'teacher-leaders' – at over 500 California school districts – **including several Sacramento area school sites.** With the expertise of teachers and UC faculty, the program annually trains thousands of teachers through intensive summer courses. <http://csmp.ucop.edu>



The UC Davis Mondavi Center's Arts Education and Community Outreach Programs provide an imaginative, accessible way for people of all ages to discover, understand, and appreciate the performing arts through performances, teacher's guides, curriculum guides and pre-matinee classroom talks. The UC Davis Health System is a leader in the field of Telemedicine. Since 1992 UC Davis has expanded the scope of its services to electronically meet the needs of the Northern California region, with the goal of linking hospitals and primary care practices in the region to the medical center to allow physicians to care for their patients locally. **UC Davis Burn Center** serves the two million residents of Yolo, Sacramento, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sierra, Sutter and Yuba counties, treating approximately 2,200 patients annually.

UC Cooperative Extension advisors in the Sacramento County office work with local agencies, growers and families to enhance water quality, introduce sustainable farming practices, improve nutrition and health, and teach youth leadership skills through **4-H.** <http://ucanr.org>
