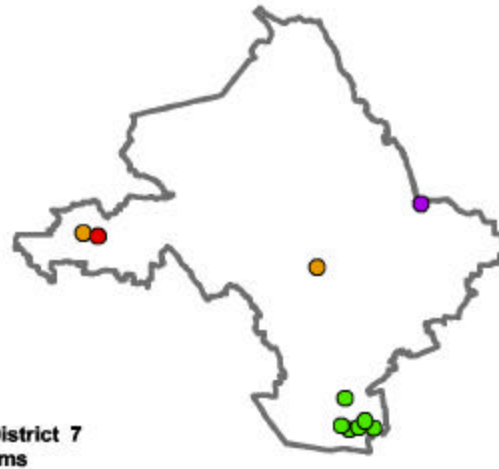


UC in Your District

UC SAN FRANCISCO MEDICAL CENTER

UCSF Medical Center provides services throughout District 7. The hospitals operated by and affiliated with UCSF are among the world's greatest health care institutions and the medical center consistently ranks among the best hospitals in the United States. UCSF is internationally known for highly specialized diagnosis and treatments. UCSF's Family Practice Residency program at Sutter Medical Center in Santa Rosa in District 7, provides a host of community medical services to underserved populations, including HIV treatment and education and targeted health outreach to Latinos



UC SAN FRANCISCO

The University of California, San Francisco near District 7, hosts a range of programs in the region and is a recognized leader in patient care, biomedical research and graduate health science education. UCSF is one of the area's largest employers, contributing more than \$1 billion annually to the Bay Area economy and spawning hundreds of biotechnology enterprises. Thousands of non-university jobs are created by its presence as a result of UCSF inventions, technology or personnel. UCSF claims three Nobel laureates in the last decade and has award winning staff and faculty.

The Breast Cancer Early Detection Program Regional Partnership, at the UCSF Comprehensive Cancer Center, provides breast cancer screening, diagnostic services, and outreach to low-income women over 40 in this district. UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) has provided academic support, career advising, college counseling and motivational/skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their

VA Northern California Health Care System is an affiliate of the UC Davis Medical Center, and provides a full range of **medical care to over 417,000 veterans in North State region.** The system includes rehab and extended care facilities, outpatient clinics and day treatment centers. <http://www.va.gov>
