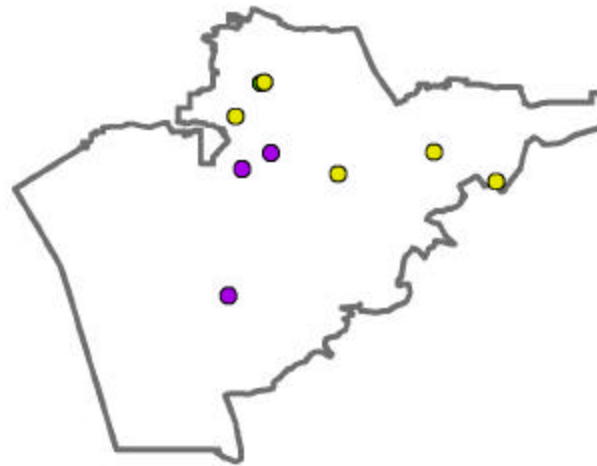


UC in Your District

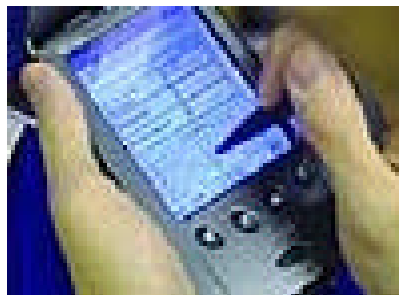

UC SAN DIEGO MEDICAL CENTER

UC San Diego Medical Center provides services throughout District 74 and is the region's only academic medical center. The medical center cares for a disproportionate share of the region's poor and uninsured patients and is the county's only Level 1 Trauma Center. **The Medical Center includes a Regional Burn Center, a National Institutes of Health Clinical Research Center, the Infant Special Care Center and the region's only National Cancer Institute.** The UC San Diego La Jolla Medical Center site offers a range of services and includes the **Shiley Eye Center**, which provides patients with vision services.



CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

To help ensure that California maintains its leadership in the telecommunications and info-tech marketplace, the **California Institute for Telecommunications and Information Technology (Cal-IT)²** teams UC researchers with leading California companies to bring wireless technology to the next stage. Researchers will investigate how these technologies will bring advances in environmental science, transportation, biomedicine and education. **Research sites will be housed on both the UC San Diego and UC Irvine campuses.**



VA NORTHERN CALIFORNIA HEALTH CARE SYSTEM (NCHCS)

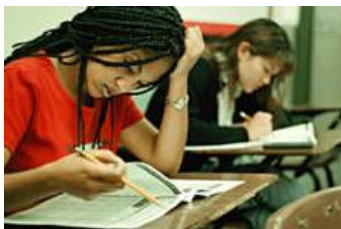
The VA San Diego Healthcare System is an affiliate of the UCSD Medical Center and provides a full range of medical care to 238,000 veterans in San Diego and Imperial Counties. The system offers a wide range of inpatient and outpatient health services at the medical center in **La Jolla** and at the **five community clinics located in Chula Vista, Escondido, Imperial Valley, Mission Valley and Vista.**

UCLA's Regional Oncology Centers, affiliated with the world-renowned UCLA Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center, provide cancer care services and investigative clinical trials at a **satellite clinic in Encinitas in District 74**. Patients who come to UCLA centers for cancer care benefit from the most advanced forms of therapy available, and from a variety of supportive services. <http://www.cancer.mednet.ucla.edu>



ArtsBridge works in partnership with California public schools to provide high quality arts education and scholarships to California's K-12 school children. **ArtsBridge works with Beaumont Elementary in Vista in District 74.**

Healthcare Access to Schools (HATS) helps children from low-income families obtain health insurance. Since its inception, UC San Diego has provided funds and technical assistance to dozens of schools. 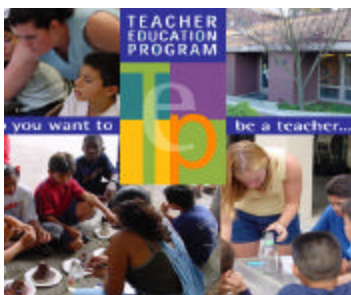
