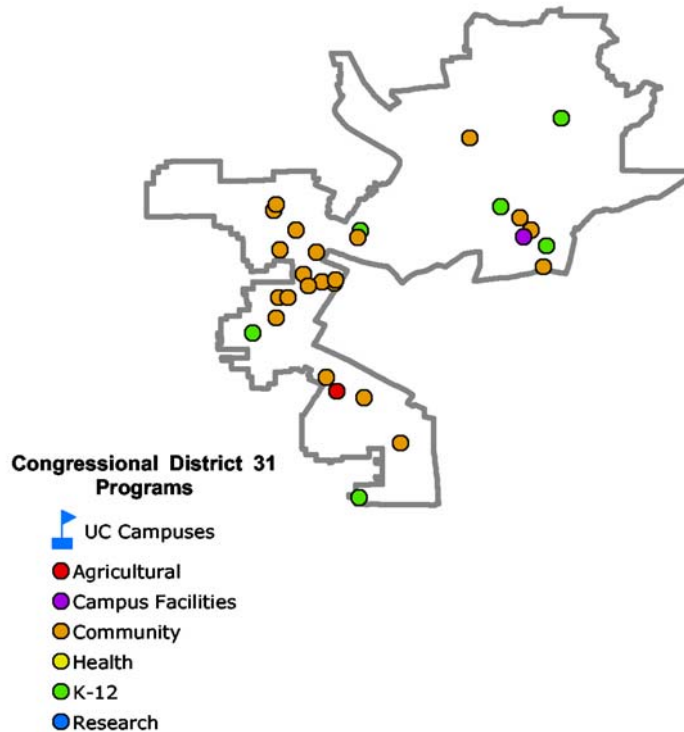


UC in Your District

UCLA MEDICAL CENTER

UCLA Medical Center provides services throughout the 30th Congressional district and is known for its pioneering advancements in organ transplantation and ultrasound, UCLA is ranked number one in the West by *U.S. News and World Report*. More than 300,000 people – including a disproportionate share of the state's indigent and uninsured population– are cared for at UCLA Medical Center each year. UCLA's Mattel Children's Hospital offers a full range of specialty health services for children. The Medical Center serves as a training site for physicians and as a research center that drives innovations in life-saving drugs and surgical procedures.



CALIFORNIA NANOSYSTEMS INSTITUTE (CNSI)

CNSI facilitates a public/private approach to developing the information, biomedical, and manufacturing technologies that will dominate science and the economy in the 21st century. The Institute provides a world-class intellectual and physical environment that supports collaboration among California's university, industry and national lab scientists. **The Institute, located at UCLA and UCSB, will include corporate-sponsored incubator labs.**



UC's K-12 OUTREACH

UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) provides academic support, college counseling and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college education. **EAOP works with several K-12 schools in the 31st Congressional district including Jefferson Middle School, Carver Middle School, Jefferson High School and Belmont High School.**

The Puente Project runs programs at 51 community colleges and 35 high schools throughout California to increase the enrollment and retention of educationally underserved students in four-year universities. Puente works

with the **Los Angeles Unified School District and East Los Angeles Community College**. To date, Puente has provided mentoring, teaching, and counseling to over 20,000 under-represented students. Puente students graduate from 4-year universities at twice the average rate. <http://www.puente.net>

UC's Design for Sharing purchases thousands of tickets to events presented by UCLA Performing Arts. Tickets are distributed through social service agencies to those who could not otherwise afford to attend the events. The program works with **several organizations in the 31st Congressional district, including the Southern California Foster Family Agency**. www.performingarts.ucla.edu

The Comprehensive School Reform Design Project (CSRDP) works with several area K-12 schools. The federally funded program provides financial incentives for schools that need to substantially improve student achievement. **UCLA's School of Management is a consultant for the program.**



UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement) works to prepare students for four-year colleges at several schools in the 31st Congressional district, including **Belmont High School**. <http://mesa.ucop.edu>

UniCamp operates educational and recreational programs for children from low-income families in the Los Angeles area. UniCamp strives to build self-esteem, promote the value of education, and foster a sense of community. **Unicamp works with low-income children throughout the 31st Congressional district, including through the Housing Authority of Los Angeles.**

UCLA's Regional Oncology Centers, affiliated with the world-renowned UCLA Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center, **provide cancer care services and investigative clinical trials at sites throughout Los Angeles**. Patients who come to UCLA centers for care benefit from the most advanced forms of therapy and from a variety of supportive services. <http://www.healthcare.ucla.edu>

The UC Davis Animal Ambassadors program uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children's interest in science. The program serves between 3,500 – 4,000 children annually using interactive materials and written curriculum. **The program is present in schools throughout Los Angeles County.**



The VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System is an affiliate of the UCLA Medical Center and provides medical care to veterans throughout the region.

The system houses a teaching hospital and provides patient care services using state-of-the-art technology. The system includes satellite clinics in **downtown Los Angeles and in East Los Angeles**. <http://www.va.gov>



UC Santa Cruz's African American Theater Arts Troupe is dedicated to providing an outlet for the creativity and talents of underrepresented students through plays, presentations and workshops on campus and throughout the community. The UCLA Mobile Eye Clinic provides free eye exams to 5,000 people in the **greater Los Angeles area**. The mobile clinic visits schools, agencies working with abused and foster children, and community organizations serving low-income families, the elderly, and the homeless.
