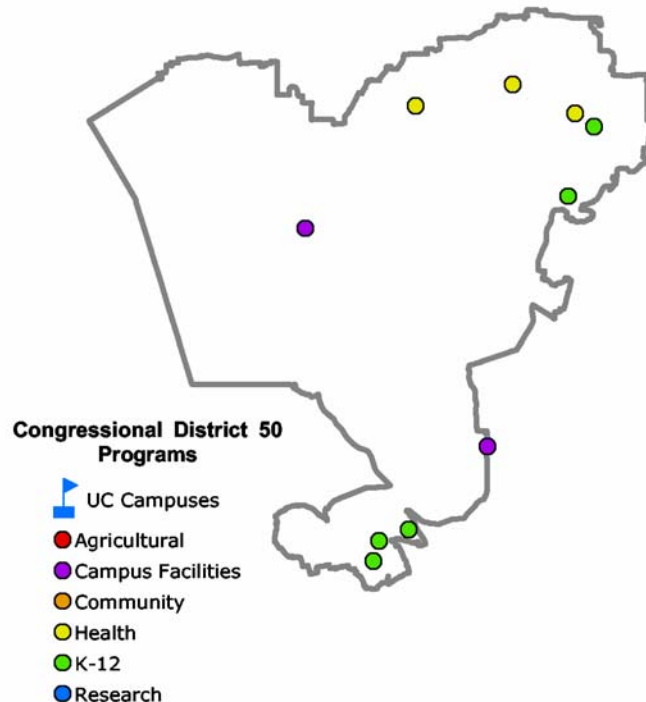


UC in Your District

UC SAN DIEGO

UC San Diego is among the nation’s top-ranked institutions of higher education, is the third largest employer in the San Diego area and has an economic impact of \$4.6 billion. In 2002 UC San Diego managed 300 new inventions, created 10 new companies and generated \$13.5 million in royalties. **UC scientists have founded one in four California biotech firms – including three of the world’s largest – Amgen, Genentech and Chiron.** The planned Graduate Management School will support the demand for management expertise in a variety of fields including biomedicine, engineering and health care.

UC SAN DIEGO MEDICAL CENTER

UC San Diego Medical Center provides services throughout the 50th Congressional District and is the region’s only academic medical center. The Medical Center cares for a disproportionate share of the region’s indigent and uninsured population and is the county’s only Level 1 Trauma Center. The Medical Center **includes a Regional Burn Center, a National Institutes of Health Clinical Research Center, the Infant Special Care Center and the region’s only National Cancer Institute.** The LA Jolla Medical Center site offers a range of services and includes the **Shiley Eye Center**, which provides pediatric and adult patients with vision services.

UC SAN DIEGO MEDICAL CENTER - VA HEALTHCARE SYSTEM

The VA San Diego Healthcare System is an affiliate of the UC San Diego Medical Center and **provides a full range of medical care to 238,000 veterans in San Diego and Imperial Counties.** The system offers a wide range of inpatient and outpatient health services **at the medical center in La Jolla and at the five community clinics located in Chula Vista, Escondido, Imperial Valley, Mission Valley and Vista.**

UCLA’s Regional Oncology Centers, affiliated with the world-renowned UCLA Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center, provide comprehensive cancer care services and investigative clinical trials at the Wilshire **Oncology Clinic satellite office in Encinitas**. Patients who come to UCLA centers for cancer care benefit from the most advanced forms of therapy available, and from a variety of supportive services. 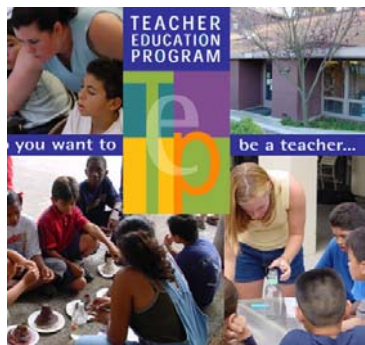
Healthcare Access to Schools (HATS) helps children from low-income families obtain health insurance. The UC San Diego Teacher Education Program works directly with K-12 schools and teachers in the greater San Diego area **including providing hands-on teacher training at schools throughout the 50th Congressional District**. UC San Diego has launched a program for graduate study leading to the Education Doctorate.

The doctoral program will provide a research-based program in education tailored exclusively for K-12 and post-secondary professional educators who wish to expand their knowledge in order to assume more leadership and better support teachers in local schools and community colleges. <http://www.tep.ucsd.edu/>

UC Davis’s Animal Ambassadors uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children’s interest in science. The program uses interactive materials and written curriculum for classrooms that develop scientific inquiry and critical thinking skills. Between 3,500 - 4,000 children participated in the program between 1999-2002. **The program is present in schools throughout San Diego County.**

BRIGHT Families works at a site in **Escondido** to improve the health and self-esteem of teens living in San Diego by sharing information and options with at-risk youth. **The UC San Diego Department of Reproductive Medicine is the lead agency for BRIGHT Families.** www.bright-families.org

Lindcove Research and Extension Center was established by local growers and UC Riverside to provide critical research on the California citrus industry. Researchers focus on areas such as the management of citrus pests.
