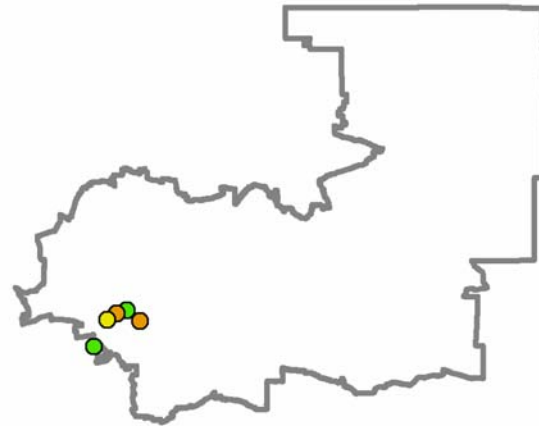


UC in Your District

UC SAN DIEGO

UC San Diego is among the nation's top-ranked institutions of higher education, is the third largest employer in the San Diego area and has an economic impact of \$4.6 billion. In 2002 UC San Diego managed 300 new inventions, created 10 new companies and generated \$13.5 million in royalties. UC scientists have founded one in four California biotech firms – including three of the world's largest – Amgen, Genentech and Chiron. The planned UCSD Graduate Management School will support the demand for management expertise in a variety of fields including biomedicine, engineering and health care.

UC SAN DIEGO MEDICAL CENTER

UC San Diego Medical Center provides services throughout the 53rd Congressional District and is the region's only academic medical center. The UCSD Medical Center cares for a disproportionate share of the region's indigent and uninsured and is the county's only Level 1 Trauma Center. The Medical Center includes a Regional Burn Center, a National Institutes of Health Clinical Research Center, the Infant Special Care Center and the region's only National Cancer Institute. The UC San Diego LA Jolla Medical Center site offers a range of services and includes the Shiley Eye Center which provides pediatric and adult patients with vision services.

UC SAN DIEGO MEDICAL CENTER - VA HEALTHCARE SYSTEM

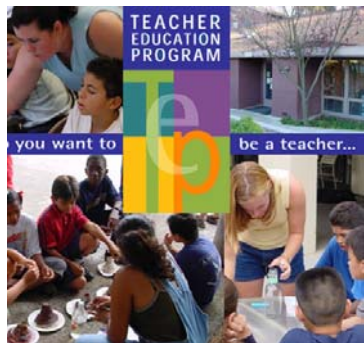
The VA San Diego Healthcare System is an affiliate of the UC San Diego Medical Center and provides a full range of medical care to 238,000 veterans in San Diego and Imperial Counties. The system offers a wide range of inpatient and outpatient health services at the medical center in La Jolla and at the five community clinics located in Chula Vista, Escondido, Imperial Valley, Mission Valley and Vista.



UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement) works to prepare educationally disadvantaged students for four-year colleges. MESA works with **Harritt Elementary and Hill Creek Elementary**.

Lindcove Research and Extension Center, established by local growers and UC Riverside, provides invaluable research for the California citrus industry on such issues as the management of citrus pests.



The UC San Diego Teacher Education Program (TEP) works directly with K-12 schools and teachers in the greater San Diego area. TEP provides research-driven, **hands-on teacher training at West Hills High School in Santee**. In addition, UC San Diego has launched a program of graduate study leading to the Education

Doctorate. **The doctoral program will provide a research-based program in education tailored exclusively for K-12 and post-secondary professional educators in the greater San Diego area** who wish to expand their knowledge of discipline-specific pedagogy, research methodology, and education leadership in order to assume more of a leadership role in supporting pre-service, beginning, and experienced teachers in local schools and community colleges. <http://www.tep.ucsd.edu/>



To help ensure that California maintains its leadership in the rapidly changing telecommunications and info-technology marketplace, **UC San Diego and UC Irvine have created the California Institute for Telecommunications and**

Information Technology (Cal-IT)². The institute teams UC researchers with leading California telecommunications, computer, software, and applications companies to conduct research on the components needed to bring the Internet and wireless technology to the next level. Researchers will further investigate how this future Internet will accelerate advances in environmental science, intelligent transportation, genomic medicine and educational practices. Research sites will be housed on both the UC San Diego and UC Irvine campuses.

The UC Davis Animal Ambassadors program uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children's interest in science. The program uses interactive materials and written curriculum for classrooms that develop scientific inquiry and critical thinking skills. Between 3,500 - 4,000 children participated in the program between 1999-2002, **including K-12 children throughout San Diego County**.

UC's Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources Cooperative Extension office in San Diego County provides comprehensive agricultural research information for local growers, ranchers, governments and the larger community.
