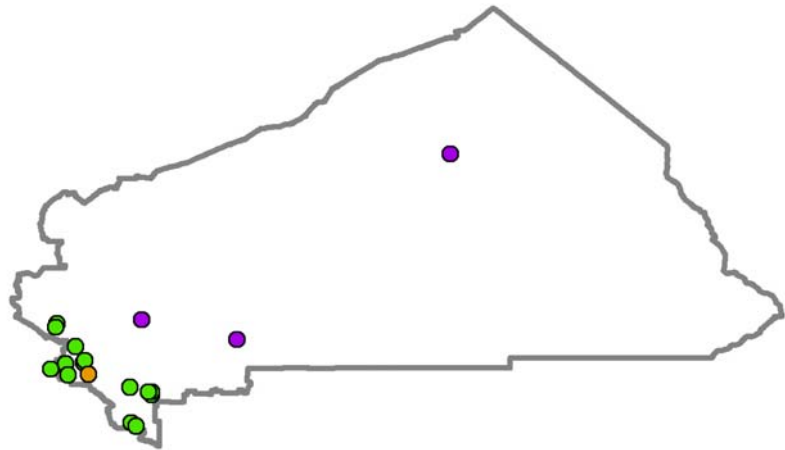


UC in Your District

UC AGRICULTURAL OUTREACH

UC's Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources Cooperative Extension provides agricultural research information for local growers, ranchers, governments and the larger community at the **Riverside and San Bernadino county offices**. UC advisors also work with families, agencies and individuals to improve nutrition, reduce child obesity, ease the transition from welfare to work and engage 4-H youth in educational activities.

THE UC RIVERSIDE GENOMICS INSTITUTE

The UC Riverside Genomics Institute brings together faculty from every academic unit on campus to foster innovations that will make possible advancements in the quality of life. UC Riverside and Quinn Community Outreach (a non-sectarian organization of Quinn AME Church) have formed a program that offers free after-school tutoring for children of all ages. **Tutors from UC provide free after-school tutoring, reading and nutritional snacks to students in Moreno Valley in District 41.**

The Community Teaching Fellowships in Math and Science work to improve education in the Inland Empire. Affiliated with the National Science Foundation and the UC Riverside School of Education, the program works with **Riverside and San Bernardino Unified Schools.** The program improves teacher knowledge and student achievement in math and science and provides mentoring for college students who want to become math and science teachers. <http://www.alphacenter.ucr.edu>



UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement) works to prepare educationally disadvantaged students for four-year colleges. The FARMS program aims to empower high school students about their futures through experiential learning and exposure to educational and career choices. UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) provides academic support, career advising, college counseling, motivational and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college

education. EAOP works with **several K-12 schools in the area, including San Jacinto High, Vista Heights Middle, North Mountain Middle and Colton High.**

The Lindcove Research and Extension Center was established by local growers and UC Riverside to provide research for the California citrus industry. Current research focuses on the management of citrus pests.



The VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System is an affiliate of the **UCLA Medical Center** and provides a **full range of medical care thousands of veterans in the region.** The system houses a teaching hospital and provides patient care services using state-of-the-art technology. **Outpatient clinics are located throughout the region.** <http://www.va.gov>

The UCLA Mobile Eye Clinic provides free eye exams to people without medical insurance or access to regular medical care in the greater Los Angeles area. The mobile unit cares for over 5,000 people a year at schools, agencies working with abused and foster children and community organizations serving low-income families, the elderly and the homeless. The unit also visits **Indian reservations in the Palm Springs region.** A patient needing eye surgery may get it at a reduced price or at no cost.



The James San Jacinto Mountains Reserve is one of 34 UC-affiliated natural reserves in the state. The site's ecological diversity makes it an important research site. **The reserve also hosts a variety of educational**

programs for Riverside County schools and the general public.
