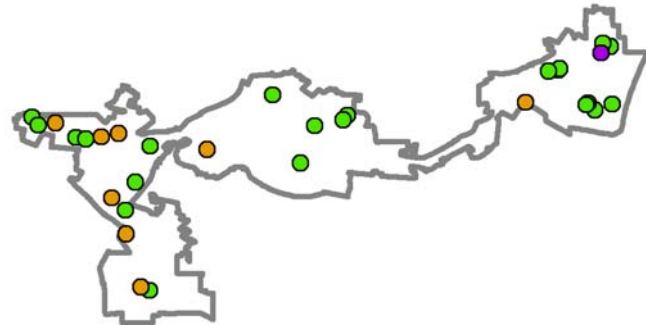


UC in Your District

UCLA MEDICAL CENTER

UCLA Medical Center provides services throughout the 32nd Congressional district and is ranked # 1 in the West by *U.S. News and World Report*. More than 300,000 people – including a disproportionate share of the state's indigent and uninsured – come to UCLA Medical Center each year. UCLA's Mattel Children's Hospital **offers a full range of specialty health services for children**. The Medical Center serves as a highly acclaimed training site for physicians, many of whom choose to stay at UCLA and as a preeminent research center that **drives innovations in life-saving drugs and surgical procedures**.

CALIFORNIA NANOSYSTEMS INSTITUTE (CNSI)

CNSI will facilitate a public/private approach to developing the information, biomedical, and manufacturing technologies that will dominate science and the economy in the 21st century. The Institute provides a world-class intellectual and physical environment that supports collaboration among California's university, industry and national lab scientists. **The Institute, located at UCLA and UCSB and will include corporate-sponsored incubator labs.**

UC NATURAL RESERVES

The UC-affiliated Stunt Ranch Santa Monica Mountains Reserve is perhaps the most pristine and biologically diverse watershed in the Santa Monica Mountains. The site's natural diversity provides excellent educational and research opportunities. The reserve, **one of 34 UC-affiliated natural reserves throughout the state**, hosts research and provides educational opportunities for local **K-12 schools**.



The Puente Project runs programs at 51 community colleges and 35 high schools throughout California to increase the enrollment and retention of educationally underserved students in four-year universities. Puente works

with schools throughout the **Whittier Union Unified School District and Cerritos Community College in Norwalk**. Puente students graduate from four-year universities at twice the average rate. <http://www.puente.net>

UC Irvine's Chemistry Outreach program employs teams of graduate and undergraduate students to visit Orange County schools to perform demonstrations and discuss chemistry related topics. Since 1992, over 24,000 students have been reached. The program works with **Cesar Chavez High School in Norwalk**. www.chem.uci.edu/~jsnowick/outreach



The History through Literature Project, within the UC Berkeley International Studies department, builds global curriculums for K-12 teachers throughout the state. Topics range from India's literary history to the spread of Islam. Seminars and an online database of lesson plans support thousands of

UC's Design for Sharing purchases thousands of tickets to events presented by UCLA Performing Arts. Tickets are distributed through social service agencies for those who could not otherwise afford to attend the events. UC Santa Barbara sponsors the Engaging Latino Communities for Education (ENLACE) initiative at several schools throughout the 38th Congressional district. The program is aimed at strengthening the educational pipeline and increasing opportunities for Latino's to enter and complete college.



UC's Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources Cooperative Extension provides comprehensive agricultural research information for local growers, ranchers, governments and the larger community at the **Los Angeles County Office**. UC works with families, agencies and individuals in Los Angeles County to improve nutrition, reduce child obesity, ease in the transition from welfare to work and engage 4-H youth in educational activities. <http://ucanr.org>

UCLA's Regional Oncology Centers, affiliated with the world-renowned UCLA Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center, **provide cancer care services and investigative clinical trials at a satellite clinic in Pomona**. The UC managed Department of Energy national laboratories host several **K-12 science education programs**. The **Lawrence Berkeley Lab's award-winning Virtual Frog Dissection Web Site** is used in K-12 classrooms statewide.



UC Santa Cruz's African American Theater Arts Troupe is dedicated to providing an outlet for the creativity and talents of underrepresented students through plays, presentations and workshops on campus and throughout the community. UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) provides academic support, career advising, college counseling and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college education. EAOP works with several **K-12 schools throughout the 38th Congressional district**, including **Montebello High School, Grand View Middle School in Valinda and three schools in Hacienda Heights**. EAOP also works with schools in **La Puente, including Giano Intermediate, Sierra Vista Middle School, Nogales High School, Bassett Senior High and La Puente High School**. <http://www.eaop.org>

The UCLA Mobile Eye Clinic provides free eye examinations to over 5,000 people each year in the **greater Los Angeles area**. The **mobile clinic visits** schools, agencies working with abused and foster children, the elderly, and homeless. Patients needing eye surgery may receive this procedure at a reduced price or at no cost.
