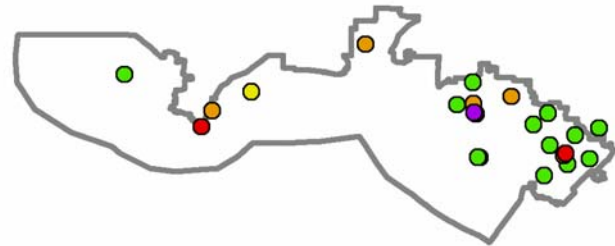




UC in Your District

UC's Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources Cooperative Extension provides comprehensive agricultural research information for local growers, ranchers, governments and the larger community through county advisors at the **Los Angeles and Orange County offices**. <http://ucanr.org>



The UC managed national labs host several science education programs, including the **Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory's** award-winning Virtual Frog Dissection web site designed for classrooms statewide.

The UC Affiliated Oiled Wildlife Care Network strives to ensure that wildlife exposed to petroleum products in the environment receive treatment. The program is managed through the UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine and provides services at a site in **Huntington Beach**. www.vetmed.ucdavis.edu/owcn



ArtsBridge is the arts education and outreach program of UC Irvine, providing scholarships to UCI students to teach the arts and conduct workshops in the Orange County community. **Artsbridge** works with **Huntington Beach High School, Woodbury Elementary and Mark Twain Special School in Garden**

The UCLA Center on Aging contributes to enhancing the quality of life by sponsoring research in medical and non-medical areas, by conducting an array of educational programs for members of the Los Angeles community, and by hosting clinical programs in geriatrics.



The VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System is an affiliate of the UCLA Medical Center and provides a full range of medical care to veterans in the region. The system houses a teaching hospital and provides patient care

services using state-of-the-art technology to thousands of **veterans throughout the region**. <http://www.va.gov>

UC Irvine's Chemistry Outreach program has teams of graduate and undergraduate students visit Orange County schools to perform demonstrations and talk about chemistry. Since 1992, over 24,000 students have been reached, including those at **Huntington Beach High and Marina High in the 46th Congressional District**.

The Puente Project runs programs at 51 community colleges and 35 high schools throughout California to increase the enrollment and retention of educationally underserved students in four-year universities. Puente Projects

works with **Golden West Community College in Huntington Beach**. Puente students graduate from 4-year universities at twice the average rate. <http://www.puente.net>



UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) provides academic support, college counseling and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams

of a college education. EAOP works with **several K-12 schools in District 46, including Marina High in Huntington Beach**. <http://www.eaop.org>

UC's California Subject Matter Projects develop teacher knowledge in major K-12 subject areas by enhancing instructional strategies, providing access to the techniques that improve student achievement, and developing 'teacher-leaders'. With the expertise of teachers and UC faculty, the program annually trains thousands of teachers through intensive summer courses **at schools throughout the 46th Congressional District**, including an intensive science program run at **Hope View Elementary in Huntington Beach**. <http://sep.uci.edu>

The UCLA Mobile Eye Clinic provides free eye examinations to people without medical insurance or access to regular medical care. Three trips per week are made in the **greater Los Angeles** area to various schools, agencies working with abused and foster children, and community organizations serving low-income families, the elderly, and the homeless. Patients are given basic eye examinations and, if needed, are referred for further treatment. A patient needing eye surgery may get it at a reduced price or at no cost. The program examines 5,000 people each year.
