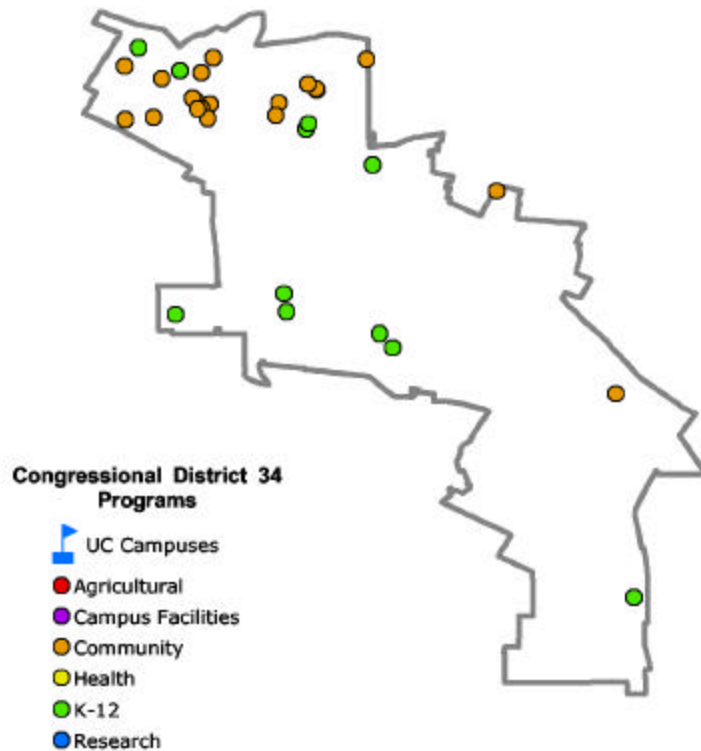


**UC in Your District**

**UCLA MEDICAL CENTER**

The **UCLA Medical Center** provides services throughout the 30<sup>th</sup> Congressional district and is known for pioneering advancements in transplantation and ultrasound. It is ranked number one in the West by *U.S. News and World Report*. More than 300,000 people – including a disproportionate share of the state's indigent and uninsured – are cared for at UCLA's Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center each year. UCLA's David Geffen School of Medicine offers a full range of specialty health services for patients. The Medical Center serves as a training site for physicians and as a research center that drives innovations in life-saving drugs and surgical



**CALIFORNIA NANOSYSTEMS INSTITUTE (CNSI)**

CNSI facilitates a public/private approach to developing the information, biomedical, and manufacturing technologies that will dominate science and the economy in the 21st century. The Institute provides a world-class intellectual and physical environment that supports collaboration among California's university, industry and national lab scientists. **The Institute, located at UCLA and UCSB, will include corporate-sponsored incubator labs.**



**UC NATURAL RESERVES**

The UC-affiliated **Stunt Ranch Santa Monica Mountains Reserve**, located near the 34<sup>th</sup> Congressional district, is the most pristine and biologically diverse watershed in the Santa Monica Mountains. The site's natural diversity remains undiminished and provides excellent educational and research opportunities. The reserve hosts environmental and anthropological research and also provides educational and outreach opportunities for the local community and K-12 schools.

**Design for Sharing** purchases thousands of tickets to be presented by UCLA Performing Arts. **UC Science Fair Initiative** increases the number of UC-bound students from underrepresented, under-performing high schools, including **Bell Gardens High School in the 34<sup>th</sup> Congressional district.** In 2000-01, 715 students from four high schools participated in this effective program. **The UC Davis Animal Ambassadors** program uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children's interest in science. Between 3,500 - 4,000 children participate in this program during 1999-2002. **The program is present throughout many schools in the Los Angeles County.**

**UC's California Subject Matter Projects** develop teacher knowledge in major K-12 subject areas by enhancing instructional strategies, providing access to techniques that improve student achievement, and developing 'teacher-lead' assessment. With the expertise of teachers and UC faculty, the program annually trains thousands of teachers through intensive summer courses, in **over 500 California school districts throughout the 34<sup>th</sup> Congressional district.** <http://csmp.ucop.edu>



**The VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System is an affiliate of the UCLA Medical Center. It provides medical care to veterans throughout the region.** The system houses a teaching hospital and

**UC Santa Cruz's African American Theater Arts Troupe** is dedicated to providing an outlet for the creativity of underrepresented students through plays, presentations and workshops on campus and in the
