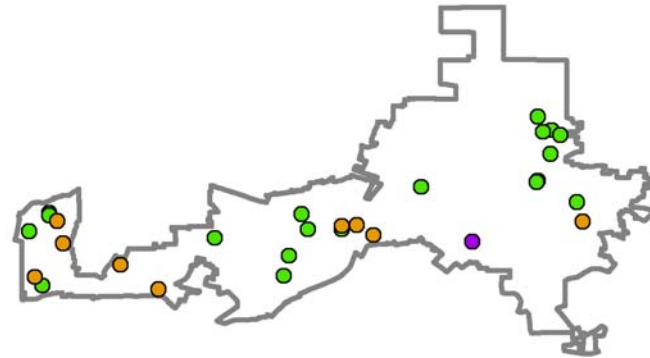


### UC in Your District

### UCLA MEDICAL CENTER

UCLA Medical Center provides services throughout the 30<sup>th</sup> Congressional district and is known for its pioneering advancements in organ transplantation and ultrasound, UCLA is ranked number one in the West by *U.S. News and World Report*. More than 300,000 people – including a disproportionate share of the state's indigent and uninsured population – are cared for at UCLA Medical Center each year. UCLA's Mattel Children's Hospital offers a full range of specialty health services for children. The Medical Center serves as a training site for physicians and as a research center that drives innovations in life-saving drugs and surgical procedures



### CALIFORNIA NANOSYSTEMS INSTITUTE (CNSI)

CNSI facilitates a public/private approach to developing the information, biomedical, and manufacturing technologies that will dominate science and the economy in the 21st century. The Institute provides a world-class intellectual and physical environment that supports collaboration among California's university, industry and national lab scientists. The Institute, located at UCLA and UCSB, will include corporate-sponsored incubator labs.



### UC's K-12 OUTREACH

UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) provides academic support, college counseling and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college education. EAOP works with several schools in District 32, including Covina High School, Baldwin Park High School, South El Monte High School and Sierra Vista High School.

**The Puente Project** runs programs at 51 community colleges and 35 high schools throughout California to increase the enrollment and retention of educationally underserved students in four-year universities. Puente works with schools

throughout the **32<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District including Whittier Union Unified School District, Rio Hondo Community College and Foothill Community College in El Monte.** To date, Puente has provided mentoring, teaching, and counseling for over 20,000 under-represented students. Puente students graduate from four-year universities at twice the average rate. <http://www.puente.net>

**The Comprehensive School Reform Design Project (CSRDP) works with three schools in El Monte, including Mountain View High.** The federally funded program provides financial incentives for schools that need to substantially improve student achievement. **UCLA's School of Management is a consultant for the program.**



The UC managed Department of Energy national laboratories host several **K-12 science education programs.** The **Lawrence Berkeley Lab's award-winning Virtual Frog Dissection Web Site is used in K-12 classrooms statewide.**

**UC's Design for Sharing** purchases thousands of tickets to events presented by UCLA Performing Arts. Tickets are distributed through social service agencies for those who could not otherwise afford to attend the events. **UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement)** works to prepare educationally disadvantaged students for four-year colleges. MESA works with **Gladstone High in Covina in the 32<sup>nd</sup> Congressional district.** <http://mesa.ucop.edu>

**UniCamp** operates educational and recreational programs for children from low-income families in the Los Angeles area. UniCamp strives to build self-esteem, promote the value of education, and foster a sense of community. **Unicamp works at multiple sites throughout the 32<sup>nd</sup> Congressional district.**

**UCLA's Regional Oncology Centers**, affiliated with the world-renowned UCLA Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center, provide comprehensive cancer care services and investigative clinical trials. Satellite clinics are located in **Monterey Park and West Covina in the 32<sup>nd</sup> Congressional district.** <http://www.healthcare.ucla.edu>

**The UC Davis Animal Ambassadors** program uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children's interest in science. The program serves between 3,500 – 4,000 children annually using interactive materials and written curriculum. **The program is present in schools throughout Los Angeles County.**



The VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System is an affiliate of the **UCLA Medical Center and provides medical care to veterans in the region.**

The system houses a teaching hospital and provides patient care services using state-of-the-art technology. The system includes a satellite clinic in **East Los Angeles.** <http://www.va.gov>
