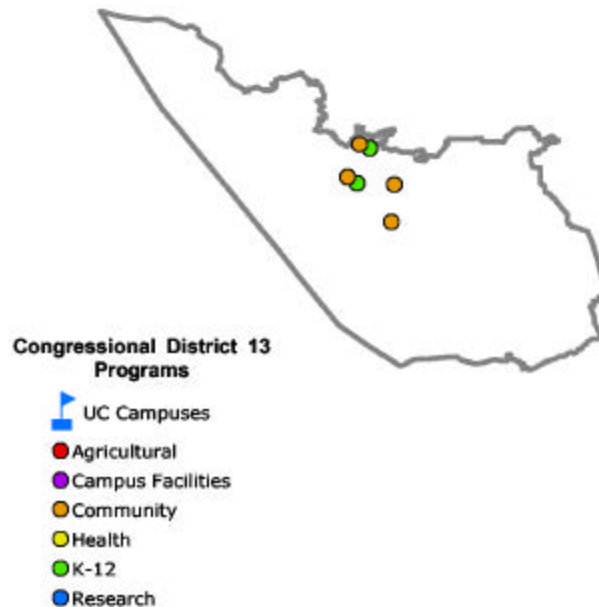


UC in Your District

LAWRENCE LIVERMORE NATIONAL LABORATORY

The Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL) is managed by UC for DOE and is located near the 13th Congressional District. LLNL is one of the world's premier scientific centers where cutting-edge science and engineering in the interest of national security is used to break new ground in energy, breast cancer and environmental research. With an annual budget of \$1.5 billion and a job base of some 8,100 people, the Laboratory has a significant impact on the local and regional economy. The Laboratory is committed to enhancing community welfare, quality of life, and educational excellence through a variety of community efforts and programs.



CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE FOR QUANTITATIVE BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH (QB 3)

QB 3 is a cooperative effort between UC and private industry aimed at developing the cutting-edge research discoveries that will continue to drive the field of biomedicine. QB 3 will drive the new technologies and research that will spawn a host of biomedical innovations and train thousands of researchers in the Bay Area. QB 3 will be housed in two new buildings at UC Santa Cruz, a new UC Berkeley facility and at a site on UC San Francisco's Mission Bay campus.

UC Berkeley is one of the world's leading academic institutions and provides one of the finest learning experiences available. UC Berkeley's academic programs are recognized internationally for excellence and the faculty includes eight Nobel Laureates. UC Berkeley has one of the best university libraries in the nation as well as distinguished museums of anthropology, paleontology and science. UC Berkeley is the largest employer in Alameda County with more than 18,000 employees and an annual total economic impact of more than \$1 billion statewide.



The Expanding Your Horizons Project at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory nurtures K-12 girl's interests in math and science subject matter and encourages them to choose careers in these fields. **The program provides conferences throughout the Bay**

Area that include hands-on workshops led by women scientists and engineers.



The Young Entrepreneurs Program at the UC Berkeley Haas School of Business is a year-long training program that provides educationally disadvantaged youths with hands-on mentoring, teaching and an innovative program which

allows students to open their own businesses. Faculty and students, in partnership with corporate sponsors, coordinate this program at high schools throughout the Bay Area.

The Center of Excellence in Women's Health at UCSF is developing a new standard for multi-disciplinary health care. The center focuses on the needs of all women by developing integrated clinical care, conducting research on women's health, providing professional education for female healthcare providers and performing community outreach.



The Puente Project increases the enrollment and retention of educationally underserved students in four-year universities. Puente works with **three Hayward high schools, Green Elementary and Fremont High in Fremont,**

James Logan High in Union City and Chabot College. To date, Puente has provided mentoring, teaching, and counseling for over 20,000 under-represented students. Puente students graduate from 4-year universities at twice the average rate.

The Bay Area Social Services Consortium (BASSC) is a partnership between county Social Service Directors and the graduate social work programs at UC Berkeley, CSU Sacramento, CSU San Jose and CSU San Francisco. BASSC develops educational, applied research and policy development programs in collaboration with county agency administrators and staff.

The Mental Health Research Group at the UC Berkeley School of Social Welfare works with California counties to pursue timely research on issues in mental health including residential care, psychiatric emergency services and homelessness. **In Alameda County, the group's research has provided an effective framework for mental health funding rates.** <http://socialwelfare.berkeley.edu>

UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) provides academic support, career advising, college counseling and motivational/skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college education. EAOP works with disadvantaged



students in 37 high schools and 37 middle schools in Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco and Santa Clara counties.

UC is a national leader in breast cancer research, treatment and prevention services. UC Berkeley's Environmental Health Sciences Center focuses on the **link between breast cancer and the environment,** while **UC San Francisco's Breast Cancer Early Detection Program Regional Partnership** provides breast cancer screening, diagnostic services, and outreach to low-income women over 40. In 2002, a **regional Breast Cancer Research Collaborative was formed** that pools the resources of UC Berkeley, UC San Francisco and the Lawrence Berkeley National Lab on this issue.
