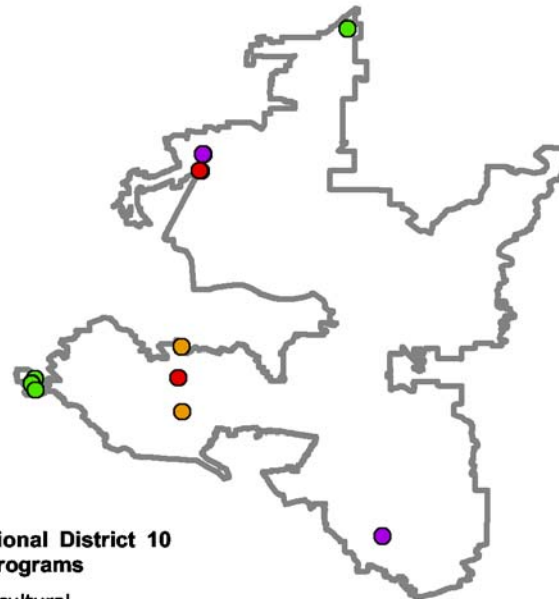


UC in Your District

CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE FOR QUANTITATIVE BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH (QB 3)

QB 3 is a cooperative effort between UC and private industry aimed at developing the cutting-edge research discoveries that will continue to drive the field of **biomedicine**. QB 3 will drive the new technologies and research that will **spawn a host of biomedical innovations and train thousands of researchers in the Bay Area**. QB 3 will be housed in two new buildings at UC Santa Cruz, a **new UC Berkeley facility** and at a site on UC San Francisco's Mission Bay campus.

LAWRENCE LIVERMORE NATIONAL LABORATORY'S K-12 OUTREACH

The **Expanding Your Horizons Project** at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory nurtures K-12 girl's interests in math and science subject matter and encourages them to choose careers in those field. **The program provides conferences throughout the Bay Area that include hands-on workshops led by women scientists and engineers.**

The UC Berkeley School of Optometry's **Meredith Morgan University Eye Center** provides optometric eye care to homebound patients and vision screening to thousands of elementary school children in **Contra Costa County**. Visits are made to patients' homes, convalescent centers and local schools. The UCB School of Optometry is the top ranked optometric teaching institution in the United States.

Young Entrepreneurs at Haas provides educationally disadvantaged youths with hands-on mentoring, teaching and an opportunity for students to actually open their own businesses. Faculty and students from UC Berkeley's

Haas School of Business, in partnership with corporate sponsors, coordinate this program at high schools throughout the East Bay, **West Contra Costa County** and San Francisco.

VA Northern California Health Care System is an affiliate of **The University of California Davis Medical Center** and provides a **full range of medical care to over 417,000 veterans in the region**. The system includes a rehabilitation program, extended care facility, an outpatient clinic and a day treatment center in **Martinez**. <http://www.va.gov>



The Puente Project runs programs at 51 community colleges and 35 high schools throughout California to increase the enrollment and retention of educationally underserved students in four-year universities. Puente

works with **Contra Costa Community College, Diablo Valley College, Solano Community College and Los Medanos Community College**. Puente students graduate from 4-year universities at twice the average rate. <http://www.puente.net>

The **New Teacher Project** provides teachers in the **Mt. Diablo Unified School District** with the opportunity to problem-solve with colleagues, learn teaching strategies and exchange lesson plans.

UC is a national leader in breast cancer research, treatment and prevention services. UC Berkeley's Environmental Health Sciences Center focuses on the **link between breast cancer and the environment**, while UC San Francisco's Breast Cancer Early Detection Program Regional Partnership provides **breast cancer screening, diagnostic services, and out-reach to low-income women over 40**. In 2002, a **regional Breast Cancer Research Collaborative** was formed that pools the resources of UC Berkeley, UC San Francisco and the Lawrence Berkeley National Lab on this issue.
