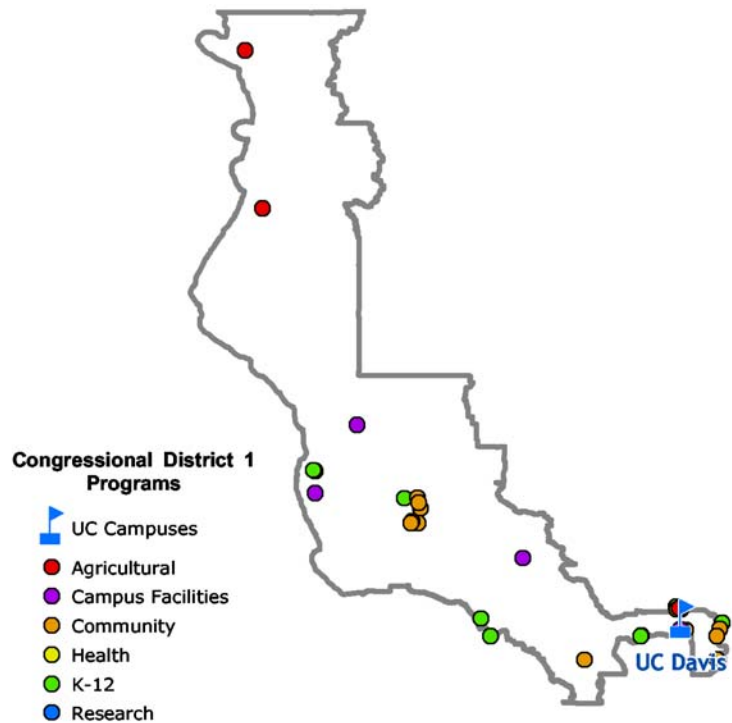


UC in Your District

UC DAVIS AND UC DAVIS MEDICAL CENTER

UC Davis is a premier research university, the largest employer in Yolo County and has an annual economic impact of more than \$1.4 billion. The UC Davis Medical Center ranks among the nation's best hospitals and is the region's only academic medical center and **Level 1 Trauma**. The **UC Davis Burn Center** serves two million residents across the region. The **recently opened Robert and Margrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts** hosts a wealth of cultural and artistic.



UC DAVIS VET MED CENTER

The Veterinary Teaching Hospital at UC Davis is the only veterinary teaching hospital in California and provides services to more than **27,000 animals each year**. UC Davis' Center for Equine Health (CEH) is leading the way in research to unravel the mysteries of colic, the painful abdominal malady that is the number one killer of horses. The School of Veterinary Medicine's new **Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Lab** will provide drug testing for California racehorses as well as study and evaluate the effectiveness of medications and other products on racehorse performance.



UC NATURAL RESERVES

UC's **Angelo Coast Range Reserve** is located on the South Fork of the Eel River in the **1st Congressional District**. The reserve encompasses four aquatic and 26 terrestrial habitats, the state's largest virgin Douglas-fir forest and the habitat of the northern spotted owl. The reserve also protects four undisturbed watersheds, among them the six-square-mile Elder Creek watershed. These pristine aquatic ecosystems support salmon, steelhead trout, river otters, and Pacific giant salamanders. **The reserve is an important site for wildlife researchers, fish biologists and watershed specialists. The reserve hosts outreach programs for K-12 students throughout the 1st Congressional District.**

The Institute works to develop greater productivity in California's \$27 billion agricultural industry and more nutritious foods to improve human health and

environmental quality.

The UC Davis Mathematics Project (UCDMP) serves teachers and school districts throughout the entire Central Valley. UCDMP offers a variety of programs for math teachers, including intensive summer institutes that provide teachers from K-Community College the opportunity to learn new math content and instructional techniques.



UC Davis Mondavi Arts Education and Community Outreach Programs provide an accessible way for people of all ages to discover the performing arts through performances, teacher's guides and classroom talks. In 2002, thousands of

students were served in **Yolo County**.

The UC Davis Animal Ambassadors program uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children's interest in science. The program uses interactive curriculums for classrooms that develop scientific inquiry and critical thinking. Between 3,500 - 4,000 children participated between 1999-2002. **The program is present in schools in Yolo, Glenn and Tehama counties.**
