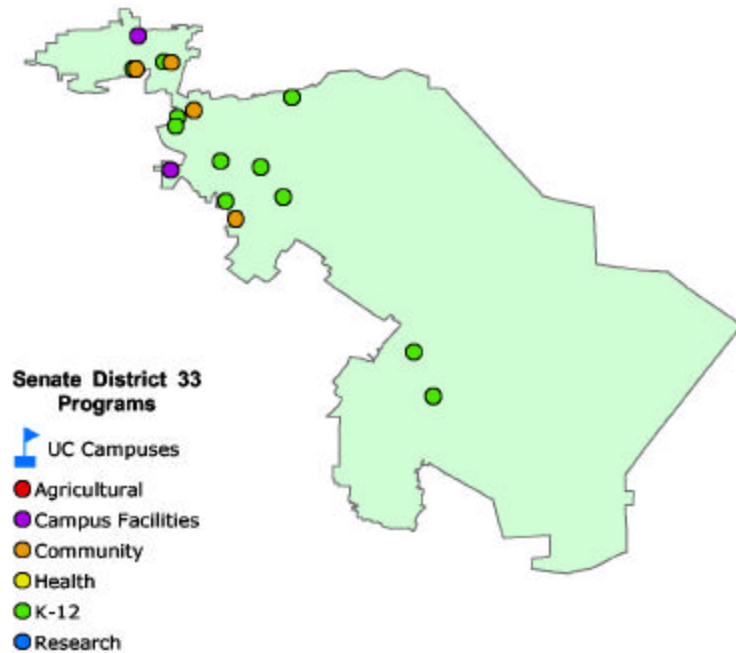

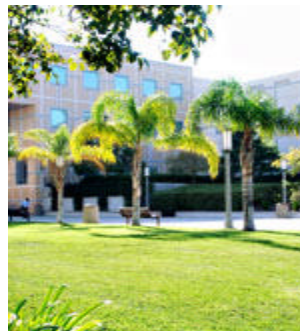

UC IRVINE MEDICAL CENTER

The UC Irvine Medical Center, located in District 33, has a strong academic reputation in neurosciences, cancer and genetics research. The UC Irvine Medical Center in Orange, California, the Long Beach Veterans Affairs Medical Center and the Long Beach Memorial Medical Center provide cutting-edge medical research to the general population and to a disproportionate share of the area's poor and uninsured. UC Irvine Medical Center's 462-bed facility is Orange County's only designated comprehensive emergency service and Level I Trauma Referral Center.

UC Irvine - near District 33, is one of the top American universities and has a \$2.35 billion economic impact on Orange County. UC Irvine is responsible for the creation of more than 15,000 jobs in Orange County. Noted internationally for its rich academic programs, UC Irvine offers 55 undergraduate majors, 49 minors and a myriad of specializations. UC Irvine also hosts a School of Education, a School of Management and the Henry Samueli School of Engineering.



CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

To help ensure that California maintains its leadership in the rapidly changing telecommunications and information technology marketplace, UC San Diego and UC Irvine have created the California Institute for Telecommunications and Information Technology (Cal-IT). The institute teams UC researchers with leading California telecomm and computer companies to conduct research on the scientific and technological components needed to bring wireless technology to the next level. Research facilities will be housed at UCSD and UCI.

The UC Irvine Gifted Students Academy provides an environment that enables students to experience the accelerated pace and advanced level curriculum required for college admissions and future careers.

UC Irvine's Chemistry Outreach program has teams of graduate and undergraduate students visit Orange County schools to perform demonstrations and talk about chemistry. Since 1992, over 24,000 students have been reached – **including those in the Anaheim Unified School District and at La Habra High in District 33.** www.chem.uci.edu

UC's California Subject Matter Projects develop teacher knowledge in K-12 subject areas by enhancing instructional strategies and developing 'teacher-leaders' – at over 500 California school districts. With the expertise of teachers and UC faculty, the program annually trains thousands of teachers through intensive summer courses **at schools throughout District 33, including Utt Middle in Tustin, Mission Viejo High and Malcolm Elementary in Laguna Niguel.**



UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement) Program works to prepare educationally disadvantaged students for four-year colleges at **South Junior High in Anaheim and Valencia High in Buena Park. The MESA California Community College**

Program increases the number of math and science majors who successfully transfer and receive degrees from four-year universities and works with **CSU Fullerton and Fullerton Community College and Santa Ana Community College.**

The Public Law Research Institute at UC's Hastings College of the Law serves California legislators and agencies by analyzing the legal issues that confront California's state and local governments. The range of research topics has included the AIDS crisis, corporate governance, welfare reform, economic development, crime control and health care reform.

UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP) has provided academic support, career advising, college counseling, motivational and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college education. EAOP works

with **several K-12 schools in the area, including Anaheim High, Magnolia High and Canyon High in District 33.**

The UCLA Mobile Eye Clinic provides free eye exams to over 5,000 people annually in the **greater Los Angeles** area. The mobile unit visits schools, agencies working with abused and foster children, and community organizations serving low-income families, the elderly, and the homeless. A patient needing eye surgery may get it at a reduced price or at no cost. The program examines 5,000 people each year.



UC Irvine's San Joaquin Freshwater Marsh Reserve, located near District 33, represents one of the last remnants of freshwater wetlands that once covered much of Orange County's flood plain. The marsh was

restored by UC Irvine (with grants from the Ford Foundation) and is located within a 10-minute walk from UCI, making it convenient for day use by faculty and hundreds of students annually. The Reserve serves as both an important research center and educational resource on issues such as migratory birds, water quality management and marsh ecosystems.
