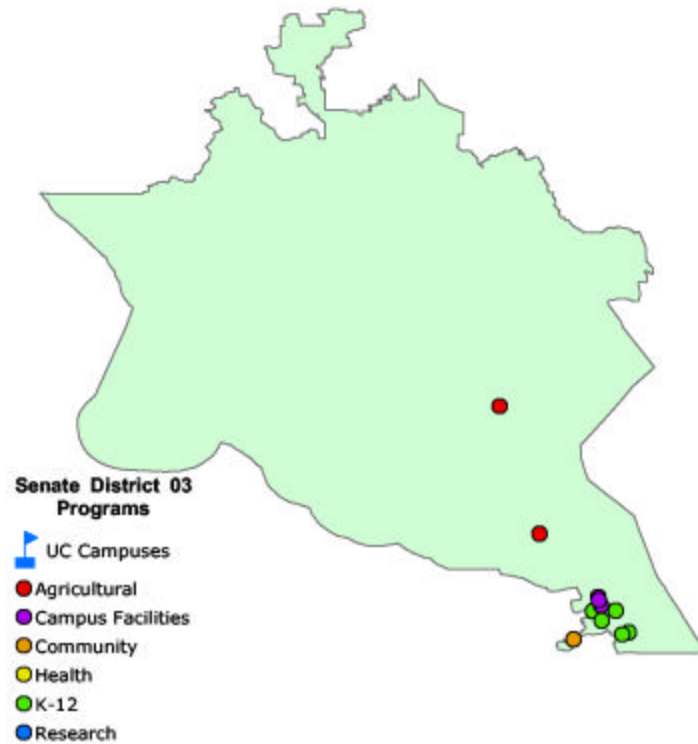


### UC in Your District

### UC SAN FRANCISCO

**UC San Francisco is one of San Francisco's largest employers, contributing more than \$1 billion annually to the Bay Area economy and spawning hundreds of biotechnology enterprises.** UCSF has created **three Nobel laureates** in the last decade and is a leader in patient care, biomedical research and graduate health science education. **UCSF Medical Center** consistently ranks among the best hospitals in the nation and with its affiliated hospitals, **handles one-half of all hospital admissions in San Francisco – and a disproportionate share of the area's poor and uninsured.**

### CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE FOR QUANTITATIVE BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH (QB3)

QB3 is a cooperative effort between **UC and private industry** aimed at developing the cutting-edge research discoveries that will continue to drive the field of biomedicine. **QB3 will drive the new technologies and research that will spawn a host of biomedical innovations and train thousands of researchers in the Bay Area.** QB3 will be housed at two new buildings on the UC Santa Cruz campus, a new UC Berkeley facility and a site at **UC San Francisco's Mission Bay campus.**

### UC/DOE NATIONAL LABS

The UC/Department of Energy **Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory and Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory are both located near District 3 and have a combined job base of 12,600.** The Livermore Laboratory is one of the world's premier scientific centers, **where cutting-edge national security research is used to break new ground in energy, breast cancer and environmental research.** The Berkeley Laboratory boasts **nine Nobel Prizes and performs research in life sciences, energy efficiency, and accelerators.** Both laboratories host a range of K-12 and community outreach programs.



**UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP)** has provided academic support, college counseling and motivational/skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their

dreams of a college education. In the Bay Area, **EAOP works with disadvantaged students in 37 high schools and 37 middle schools in Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco and Santa Clara counties.** <http://www.eaop.org>

**The Mental Health Research Group at UC Berkeley's School of Social Welfare** works with California counties to pursue timely research on issues in mental health such as residential care, psychiatric emergency services and homelessness. <http://socialwelfare.berkeley.edu>



**UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement)** works to prepare students for four-year colleges at several schools in **District 3, including Malcolm X Academy.** **The MESA California Community College Program** increases the number of math and science majors

who transfer and receive university degrees and runs a program site at **CSU San Francisco.** <http://mesa.ucop.edu>

In response to high breast cancer rates in Marin County, epidemiologists from UCSF began working to document the disease in the region and in 2002, the **Marin Breast Cancer Research Collaborative** was formed to **address this critical issue.** The collaborative is a joint research project between **UC Berkeley, UCSF, the UC-affiliated National Laboratories** and the Marin County Department of Health and Human Services.



UC Berkeley's **Lawrence Hall of Science Alliance for Collaborative Change in School Systems (ACCESS)** works with the **San Francisco Unified School District** to strengthen the capacity of schools to prepare students from historically under-represented groups for college. <http://www.lhs.berkeley.edu/>

Medical students from the **UCSF School of Medicine** provide regular treatment to incarcerated individuals at **San Quentin Prison** as part of their training.

**UCSF's Family Practice Residency Program** at Sutter Medical Center in **Santa Rosa** provides a host of community medical services to **underserved populations in District 3.** **Services include** HIV treatment and education and health outreach for Latinos. <http://www.fpresidencyantarosa.org>

**UC Berkeley's Environmental Sciences Program** has worked in partnership with the **Galileo Academy of Science and Technology** and the **Urban Watershed Project** to implement a three-year high school environmental science course. The course incorporates field study, mentoring and web-based learning under the guidance of the National Park Service at the **Presidio in San Francisco.**



**The History through Literature Project at UC Berkeley** builds curriculums for K-12 teachers on topics ranging from Latin America's literary history to the spread of Islam. Seminars and an online

database of lesson plans support thousands of teachers statewide. <http://www.ias.berkeley.edu/orias>

**UCSF's Breast Cancer Early Detection Program Regional Partnership,** provides breast cancer screening, diagnostic services, and out-reach to low-income women over 40. <http://www.ucsfbreastcarecenter.org>

**UCSF research was among the first to identify HIV** and the campus continues to lead in HIV treatment and research. **The UCSF AIDS Health Project** is the sole provider of HIV-specific mental health programs. **HIV InSite** is a web resource for HIV treatment and policy that links UC expertise with academics, doctors and patients worldwide. <http://hivinsite.ucsf.edu>

**The Public Law Research Institute at UC's Hastings College of the Law** serves California legislators and agencies by analyzing the legal issues that confront California's state and local governments. Research topics have included: the AIDS crisis, corporate governance, welfare reform and crime control.



**Nursing faculty from UCSF and CSU San Francisco** have partnered at the Valencia Health Services Clinic to provide health care to **2,650 infants, children and adolescents in San Francisco.** The clinic combines UC's expertise in pediatric, women's health, and family care

medicine and CSU's experience in case management and public health. <http://nurseweb.ucsf.edu>

**UCSF's Student Homeless Clinic** provides the services of medical and nursing students to the homeless at the 5th Street Multi-Service Center in San Francisco. **UCSF's Homeless Veterans Health Care** program also reaches homeless veterans in San Francisco shelters and on the streets.

**The UCSF Community Outreach Internship Program** works in partnership with a welfare-to-work readiness program to create jobs, coaching, and mentoring for area residents.
