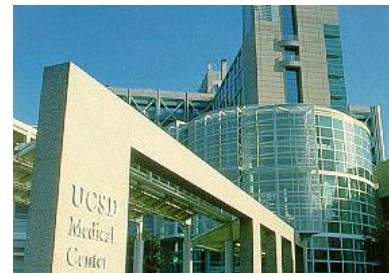
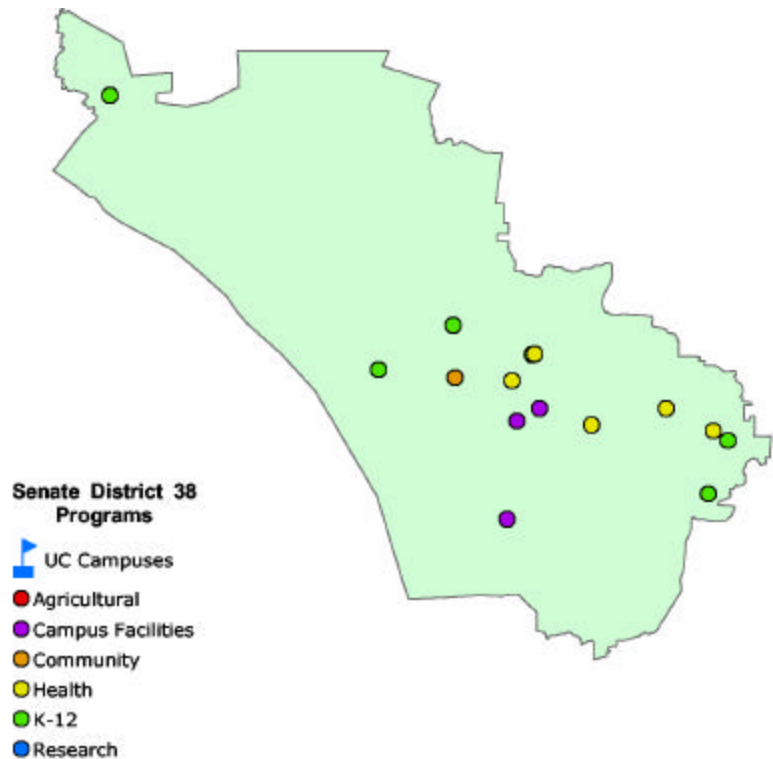


### UC in Your District

### UC SAN DIEGO

**UC San Diego is among the nation's top-ranked institutions of higher education, is the third-largest employer in the San Diego area and has an economic impact of \$4.6 billion.** In 2002, UC San Diego managed 300 new inventions, created 10 new companies and generated \$13.5 million in royalties. **UC scientists have founded one in four California biotech firms – including three of the world's largest – Amgen, Genentech and Chiron.** The planned Graduate Management School will support the demand for management expertise in a variety of fields including biomedicine, engineering and health-care.

### UCSD MEDICAL CENTER - VA HEALTHCARE SYSTEM

The VA San Diego Healthcare System is an affiliate of the UCSD Medical Center and provides a full range of medical care to **238,000 veterans** in San Diego and Imperial Counties. **The system offers a wide range of inpatient and outpatient health services at the medical center in La Jolla and at the five community clinics located in Chula Vista, Escondido, Imperial Valley, Mission Valley and Vista.**

### UC SAN DIEGO MEDICAL CENTER

**UC San Diego Medical Center provides services throughout District 38** and is the region's only academic medical center. The medical center cares for a disproportionate share of the region's poor and uninsured patients and is the county's only Level 1 Trauma Center. The Medical Center includes a **Regional Burn Center, a National Institutes of Health Clinical Research Center, the Infant Special Care Center and the region's only National Cancer Institute.** The UC San Diego LA Jolla Medical Center site offers a range of services and includes the **Shiley Eye Center**, which provides pediatric and adult patients with vision services.

**Healthcare Access to Schools (HATS)** helps children from low-income families obtain health insurance. Since its inception, UC San Diego has provided funds and technical assistance to dozens of schools, **including four schools in Escondido.**



**UC's Early Academic Outreach Program (EAOP)** has provided academic support, career advising, college counseling, motivational and skill-building workshops to help over 85,000 California students realize their dreams of a college

education. **EAOP works with several schools including El Camino, Escondido, Orange Glen and Vista High Schools and Hidden Valley, Jefferson, Martin Luther King Jr. and Roosevelt Middle Schools in District 38.** <http://www.eaop.org>

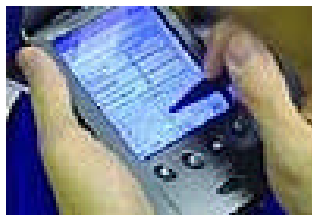
**UCLA's Regional Oncology Centers**, affiliated with the world-renowned UCLA Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center, provide cancer care services and investigative clinical trials at a **satellite clinic in Vista in District 38.** Patients who come to UCLA centers for cancer care benefit from the most advanced forms of therapy available, and from a variety of supportive services. <http://www.cancer.mednet.ucla.edu>

A UC systemwide multi-campus research unit, **the Center for Water and Wildland Resources** coordinates research on water conservation and management. **The UC Davis Animal Ambassadors** program uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children's interest in science. The program uses interactive materials and written curriculum for classrooms that develop scientific inquiry and critical thinking skills. **The program is present in schools throughout San Diego County.**

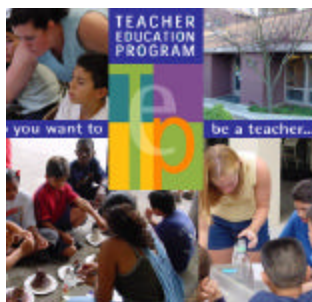


To help ensure that California maintains its leadership in the rapidly changing telecommunications and info-technology marketplace, **UC San Diego and UC Irvine have created the California Institute for**

**Telecommunications and Information Technology (Cal-IT)<sup>2</sup>.** The institute teams UC researchers with leading California telecomm and computer companies to conduct research on the components needed to bring wireless technology to the next level. <http://www.calit2.net/>

**California Partners for Advanced Transit in Highways (PATH), at the UC Institute of Transportation Studies**, brings together faculty and students with private industry and state/local agencies to develop the research technologies that will improve California's transport systems. PATH is working to develop lasting solutions for the state's public transit challenges.

**The Mental Health Research Group at UC Berkeley's School of Social Welfare** works with California counties to pursue timely research on issues in mental health such as residential care, psychiatric emergency services and homelessness. <http://socialwelfare.berkeley.edu>



**The UCSD Teacher Education Program (TEP)** provides hands-on teacher training at **several K-12 schools in District 38.** UCSD has launched a program of graduate study leading to the Education Doctorate that will provide a **research-based program in education tailored exclusively for K-12 educators in the area.**

**UC's Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources Cooperative Extension** provides accessible and comprehensive agricultural research information for local growers, ranchers, governments and the larger community at the **Orange and San Diego County offices.** UC advisors also administer 4-H projects and after-school activities for local youth, provide research information for local nursery operators and farmers and advise boat owners on how to reduce impacts on water quality in the San Diego region. <http://www.ucanr.org>

**UCSD operates University Link with Mira Costa and Palomar Colleges and Oceanside and El Camino High Schools in the 38<sup>th</sup> district.** This program works to streamline and improve the transfer process from local community colleges – with the goal of making it easier for local students to plan for and gain qualified admittance to UCSD.
