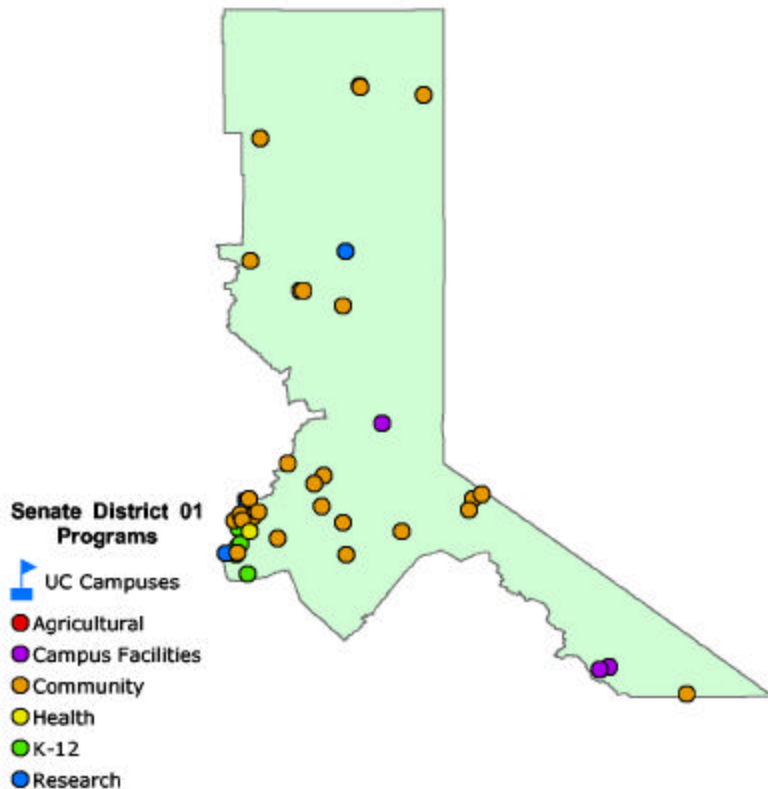


### UC in Your District

### UC DAVIS TAHOE RESEARCH GROUP

**The UC Davis Tahoe Research Group (TRG) - located in District 1**, is composed of public and private partners within the Tahoe basin and at UCD, and is **at the forefront of environmental research – on issues such as watershed and lake management**. The new center, under development, will be a living laboratory and educational center that will enable the TRG and collaborating researchers to piece together a complete picture of the complex dynamics of the lake's environment.



### UC DAVIS VET MED CENTER

The Veterinary Teaching Hospital at UCD is the only veterinary teaching hospital in California and **provides services to more than 27,000 animals each year**. UC Davis' Center for Equine Health (CEH) is leading the way in research to unravel the mysteries of colic, the painful abdominal malady that is the number one killer of horses. The School of Vet Medicine's new **Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Lab** will provide drug testing for California racehorses as well as studies evaluating the effectiveness of medications and other products on racehorse performance.



### EAGLE LAKE FIELD STATION

**The UC-affiliated Eagle Lake Field Station in Susanville in District 1** conducts practical and cutting-edge environmental research and offers a variety of field courses and visiting programs in topics such as surveying and wildlife and fish biology.



**UC's MESA (Mathematics, Engineering & Science Achievement)** works to prepare educationally disadvantaged students for four-year colleges at **K-12 school sites in the North State region – including Heritage Oaks Elementary in Roseville, Folsom Hills Elementary and Chico High School and Chico Junior High School – all in District 1.**

**The UC Davis Mondavi Center's Arts Education and Community Outreach Programs** provide an accessible way for people of all ages to discover and appreciate the performing arts through performances, teacher's guides, curriculum guides and pre-matinee classroom talks. In 2001-2002, 25,000 K-12 students were served across **El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento, Solano, and Yolo counties.** <http://www.mondaviarts.org>

**The UC Davis Animal Ambassadors** program uses web-based and hands-on interaction with animals to foster children's interest in science. The program uses interactive materials and written curriculum for classrooms that develop scientific inquiry and critical thinking skills. Between 3,500 - 4,000 children participated in the program between 1999-2002 **in schools throughout Yolo, El Dorado, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Marin, Glenn, Tehama, Los Angeles and Sacramento counties.**

**The UC Davis Health System is a leader in the field of "Telemedicine"** by electronically linking hospitals and primary care practices in rural areas to the UC Davis Medical Center to allow physicians to care for their patients locally.

**The UC Davis Burn Center serves the two million residents** of Yolo, Sacramento, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sierra, Sutter and Yuba counties - treating approximately 2,200 patients annually.

**UC's California Subject Matter Projects** develop teacher knowledge in K-12 subjects by enhancing instructional strategies, improving **teacher retention** and developing 'teacher-leaders' – at over 500 California school districts – **including schools in District 1 such as Johnstonville Elementary in Susanville and Maidu Elementary in Roseville.** With the expertise of teachers and UC faculty, the program annually trains thousands of teachers through intensive summer courses. <http://csmp.ucop.edu>



**The UC Davis Mathematics Project (UCDMP) serves teachers and school districts throughout the entire Central Valley and into the lower reaches of the Sierras.** UCDMP offers a variety of programs for math teachers, including intensive Summer Institutes that provide teachers from K-Community College the opportunity to develop problem-solving strategies, learn new math content and instructional techniques.

As an employer and as a consumer of goods and services, UC fuels the local economy. **UC Davis is the largest employer in Yolo County and the second largest employer in the Capitol area** second only to the State of California. Overall annual spending by both the campus and the medical center amounts to more than \$1.4 billion statewide.

**The UC Davis Medical Center located near District 1**, is the region's only academic medical center and is a fully accredited, 457-bed hospital. The UCD Medical center operates a **Nursing Research Center and the Center for Health Services Research in Primary Care** which provides research and evaluation services relating to primary care medicine and its organization, cost, quality and effect upon patient outcomes. **According to U.S. News & World Report, the UC Davis Medical Center ranks among the nation's best hospitals in the areas of endocrinology, pulmonary disease, neurology, urology, orthopaedics, cancer and otolaryngology.**
