



## Using Advanced Placement to Satisfy UC Transfer Admission and IGETC (2011-12)

The University of California grants credit for all College Board Advanced Placement Tests on which a student scores 3 or higher. Students should be aware that college courses taken may duplicate the content of AP examinations. In these cases, the University may not award credit for both the course and the AP exam. Each exam listed below may be used in lieu of one course to satisfy one UC Transfer Subject Area requirement or one IGETC area and the area 6A (Language other than English) proficiency level as listed. In many cases, satisfaction of general education requirements or credit toward specific major requirements is also awarded by the campuses. Consult the campus regarding issues about how AP credit is granted for each major in each department. New AP exams will be reviewed as they are developed and included on the chart where appropriate.
