Budget Update

As was recently announced, we are facing additional significant cuts to our budget, both for the current year and next year. Although we don't yet know all the implications of these additional cuts, they are serious and we must prepare for them accordingly. That is why I issued a message yesterday announcing a number of measures to restrict spending further. At the same time, President Yudof along with the leaders of the California State University and Community College systems testified in Sacramento yesterday about the impacts of the cuts on the University and its service to the people of California.
