



Cecil Lytle

Cecil Lytle has been a Professor of Music at the University of California at San Diego since 1974. An internationally renowned concert pianist, he has performed and recorded around the world - including such prestigious venues as the Boston Pops, San Francisco Symphony and the Royal Albert Hall. Professor Lytle was recently appointed Director of the University of California Study Center for the UK and Ireland. Professor Lytle has won six National Endowment for the Arts Awards, three commissions from the California Commission on the Arts, has been a Distinguished Visiting Professor and Artists-in-Residence at the Darmstadt Music Festival and the Beijing Conservatory of Music, and was appointed Senior Fulbright-Hays Scholar to the UK. His lecture-performance TV series, *The Nature of Genius*, was nominated for an Emmy. In addition to continuing professional appearances, recordings and teaching - Professor Lytle has successfully led the initiative to establish a model charter school at UCSD to educate under-represented and disadvantaged youth.
