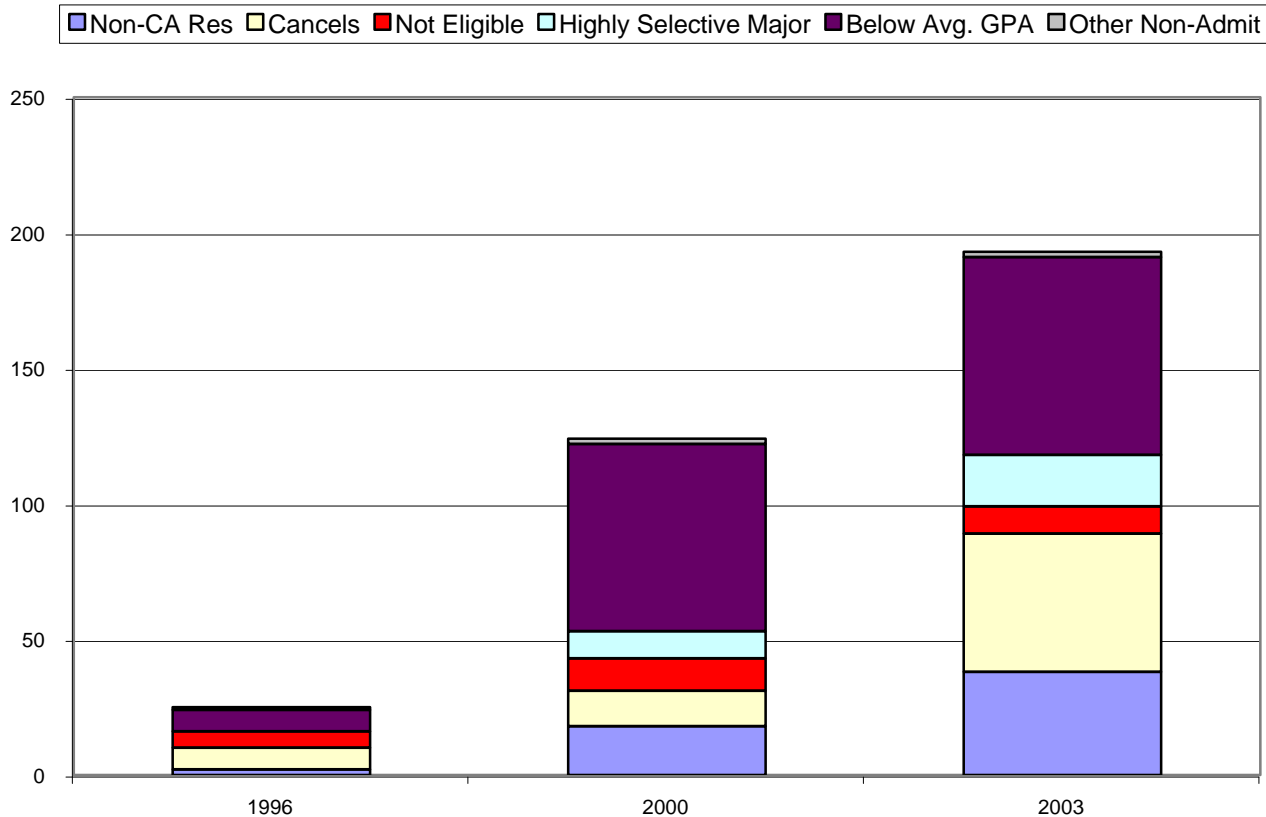


UC Irvine Non-Admits with SAT I Scores > 1400

Notes on Data:

2. Categories below Total Non-Admits sequentially remove applicants from the Non-Admit total for the indicated reason.
3. Below average GPA is specific to each campus. High School GPA includes an extra grade point for up to eight UC-approved honors courses in which a grade of C or higher was earned.
4. At UC Berkeley, highly selective majors are from the College of Engineering: EECS, Undeclared, and Bioengineering. At other campus, all engineering majors are defined as highly selective. In addition, at UCLA, all majors in the School of Theater, Film, and Television are considered highly selective.
